ORDER APPROVING
TRANSFER NO. 3620

On April 11, 1977, an application was filed in the office of the Water Resources Director by Carl M. Macedo, Jr. and Twyla L. Macedo for changes in place of use and point of diversion under an existing water right of record, pursuant to the provisions of ORS 540.510 to 540.530.

The certificate recorded at page 17210, Volume 14, State Record of Water Right Certificates, in the name of Gus Peck, describes a right which includes the use of not to exceed 0.07 cubic foot per second from South Fork Little Butte Creek for irrigation of a certain 3.0 acres in NW $\frac{1}{4}$ NW $\frac{1}{4}$ of Section 3, Township 37 South, Range 2 East, W.M., with a date of priority of 1888.

Water for the said right is diverted through the Randles and Ragsdale Ditch from a point located 330 feet South and 680 feet West from the Northeast corner of Section 10, being within the NE $\frac{1}{4}$ NE $\frac{1}{4}$ of Section 10, Township 37 South, Range 2 East, W.M.

The applicants herein, owners of the lands above described, propose to change the place of use and point of diversion therefrom and, without loss of priority, to irrigate a certain other 3.0 acres in said NW $\frac{1}{4}$ NW $\frac{1}{4}$ of Section 3 from a point of diversion located 1160 feet South and 130 feet East from the Northwest corner of Section 3, being within the said NW $\frac{1}{4}$ NW $\frac{1}{4}$ of Section 3.

Notice of the application, pursuant to ORS 540.510, was published in the Medford Mail Tribune, a newspaper printed and having general circulation in Jackson County, Oregon, for a period of three weeks in the issues of July 1, 8 and 15, 1977.

Mr. David C. Hendrix, Watermaster, has filed a statement to the effect that the proposed changes in place of use and point of diversion may be made without injury to existing rights.

No objections having been filed and it appearing that the proposed changes in place of use and point of diversion may be made without injury to existing rights, the application should be approved.

NOW, THEREFORE, it hereby is ORDERED that the requested changes in place of use and point of diversion as described herein, without loss of priority, are approved.

It is FURTHER ORDERED that the quantity of water diverted at the new point of diversion shall not exceed the quantity of water available at the old point of diversion under the subject right, and shall not exceed 0.07 cubic foot per second.

It is FURTHER ORDERED that the following provisions shall be effective when in the judgement of the watermaster it becomes necessary to install head-gates and measuring devices:

That the diversion works shall include an in line flow meter, a weir, or other suitable device for measuring the water to which the applicant is entitled;

That the type and plans of the measuring device be approved by the watermaster before the beginning of construction work and that the weir or measuring device be installed under the general supervision of said watermaster.


It is FURTHER ORDERED that the construction work shall be completed and the change in point of diversion of water made and said water so transferred shall be applied to beneficial use on or before October 1, 1979.

It is FURTHER ORDERED that the certificate of water right heretofore issued to Gus Peck and recorded at page 17210, Volume 14, State Record of Water

RIGHT CERTIFICATE

Right Certificate, is canceled, and in lieu thereof a new certificate be issued covering the balance of the right NOT involved in this proceeding, and upon proof satisfactory to the Water Resources Director of completion of works and beneficial use of water to the extent intended under the provisions of this order, a confirming certificate of water right shall be issued to the applicant herein.
