PLACE OF USE OF WATER )

On May 30, 1985, an application was filed in the office of the Water Resources Director by Ernest J. and Doreene Livermore for approval of a change in place of use of water from John Day River, pursuant to the provisions of ORS 540.510 to 540.530.

By Decree of the Circuit Court for Grant County, Oregon, entered November 16, 1956, In the Matter of the Determination of the Relative Rights to the Use of the Waters of John Day River and Its Tributaries, a water right was established in the name of Bradford C. Trowbridge, tabulated in Volume 10, page 618, Order Record of the Water Resources Director, for use of not to exceed 0.01 cubic foot per second from John Day River for irrigation of, among other lands, a certain 0.4 acre in NE 1/4 SW 1/4, Section 23, Township 13 South, Range 31 East, WM, with a date of priority of 1863, as evidenced by the certificate recorded at page 51975, Volume 46, State Record of Water Right Certificates.

Water for the said right is diverted, through the Trowbridge Ditch, from a point located 460 feet South and 920 feet West from the Northeast Corner of Section 25, being within the NE 1/4 NE 1/4 of Section 25, Township 13 South, Range 31 East, WM.

The applicants herein, owners of the lands above described, propose to change the place of use therefrom to irrigation of a certain other 0.4 acre in NE 1/4 SW 1/4, Section 23, Township 13 South, Range 31 East, WM.

Jerry S. Rodgers Watermaster, has filed a statement to the effect that the proposed change in place of use may be made without injury to existing rights.

No objections having been filed and it appearing that the proposed change in place of use may be made without injury to existing rights, the application should be approved.

NOW, THEREFORE, it hereby is ORDERED that the proposed change in place of use is approved, without loss of priority.

It is FURTHER ORDERED that the quantity of water diverted shall not exceed 0.01 cubic foot per second.

It is FURTHER ORDERED that the following provisions shall be effective when in the judgment of the Watermaster it becomes necessary to install headgates and measuring devices:


That the diversion works shall include an in-line flow meter, a weir, or other suitable device for measuring the water to which the applicant is entitled;

That the type and plans of the measuring device be approved by the watermaster before the beginning of construction work and that the weir or measuring device be installed under the general supervision of said watermaster.

It is FURTHER ORDERED that said water so transferred shall be applied to beneficial use on or before October 1, 1986.

It is FURTHER ORDERED that the certificate recorded at page 51975, Volume 46, State Record of Water Right Certificates, is canceled; and in lieu thereof a new certificate be issued covering the balance of the right NOT involved in this proceeding; and upon proof satisfactory to the Water Resources Director of completion of works and beneficial use of water to the extent intended under the provisions of this order, a confirming certificate of water right shall be issued to the applicants herein.
