) AND A CHANGE IN PLACE OF USE

Authority

Oregon Revised Statute (ORS) 537.211 establishes the process in which a water right permit holder may submit a request to change the point of appropriation and/or place of use authorized under an existing water right permit.

Findings of Fact

1. On February 11, 2021, UNIVERSITY OF PORTLAND, ATTN: MR. JIM RAVELLI, filed an application for an additional point of appropriation and a change in place of use under Permit G-16085. The Department assigned the application number T-13616.
2. On January 30, 2015, the Department approved an extension of time for complete application of water to October 1, 2032.
3. On June 11, 2021 the Department received a revision to the applicant contact and signature page. Jennie Cambier is the new contact.
4. Notice of the application for the permit amendment was published in the Department's weekly notice on March 2, 2021, and in the Portland Tribune newspaper on December 2 and 9, 2022, pursuant to ORS 540.520(5).
5. Permit Amendment Application T-13616 proposes an additional point of appropriation approximately 0.4 mile from the existing point of appropriation to:

This is a final order in other than contested case. This order is subject to judicial review under ORS 183.484. Any petition for judicial review must be filed within the 60 day time period specified by ORS 183.484(2). Pursuant to ORS 536.075 and OAR 137-004-0080 and OAR 690-01-0005 you may either petition for judicial review or petition the Director for reconsideration of this order. A petition for reconsideration may be granted or denied by the Director, and if no action is taken within 60 days following the date the petition was filed, the petition shall be deemed denied.

6. Permit Amendment Application T-13616 also proposes to change the place of use of the permit to:

Permit Amendment Review Criteria

7. The changes would not result in injury to other water rights.
8. The proposed place of use is owned and/or controlled by the permit holder.
9. The changes do not enlarge the permit.
10. The changes do not alter any other terms of the permit.
11. The proposed place of use is contiguous to the authorized place of use.

Conclusions of Law

The additional point of appropriation and change in place of use proposed by Permit Amendment Application T-13616 is consistent with the requirements of ORS 537.211.

Now, therefore, it is ORDERED:

1. The additional point of appropriation and change in place of use proposed by Permit Amendment Application T-13616 are approved.
2. Permit G-18822, in the name of UNIVERSITY OF PORTLAND, ATTN: MS. JENNIE CAMBIER, is issued to replace Permit G-16085, and incorporates the amendments approved by this order and the extension of time. Permit G-16085, in the name of UNIVERSITY OF PORTLAND, is no longer of any force or effect.
3. The combined quantity of water diverted at the new additional point of appropriation (WELL 5), together with that diverted at the original point of appropriation (WELL 1), shall not exceed the quantity of water lawfully available at the original point of appropriation.


4. Water use measurement conditions:

- a. Before water use may begin under this order, the water user shall install a totalizing flow meter, or, with prior approval of the Director, another suitable measuring device at each point of appropriation at each new point of appropriation with the exception that water rights issued to the Bureau of Reclamation or an irrigation district (or similar entity) are not subject to this condition.
- b. The water user shall maintain the meters or measuring devices in good working order.
- c. The water user shall allow the Watermaster access to the meters or measuring devices; provided however, where the meters or measuring devices are located within a private structure, the Watermaster shall request access upon reasonable notice.

5. Water shall be acquired from the same aquifer as the original point of appropriation.

6. All other terms and conditions of Permit G-18822 remain the same.
