ORDER APPROVING TRANSFER NO. 3870

12.

On January 20, 1978, an application was filed in the office of the Water Resources Director by Franklin Hoeft for approval of changes in place of use and point of diversion from Birch Creek, pursuant to the provisions of ORS 540.510 to 540.530.

The certificate recorded at page 2579, Volume 3, State Record of Water Right Certificates, in the name of Louis Male, describes a right which includes the use of not to exceed 0.28 cubic foot per second from Birch Creek for irrigation of 12.0 acres in NW4 NE4 and 10.0 acres in NW4 SE4 of Section 27, Township 1 North, Range 32 East, W.M., with a date of priority of 1908.

Water for the said right is diverted from a point located 50 feet North and 475 feet East from the South Quarter Corner of Section 27, being within the SW_4 SE_4 of Section 27, Township 1 North, Range 32 East, W.M.

The applicant herein, owner of the lands above described, proposes to change the place of use and point of diversion therefrom and, without loss of priority, to irrigate in lieu thereof a certain 22.0 acres in SE^{1}_{4} NW^{1}_{4} of said Section 27, from a point of diversion located 1630 feet South and 260 feet West from the North Quarter Corner of Section 27, being within the SE^{1}_{4} NW^{1}_{4} of Section 27, Township 1 North, Range 32 East, W.M.

Notice of the application, pursuant to ORS 540.520(2), was published in the East Oregonian, a newspaper printed and having general circulation in Umatilla County, Oregon, for a period of three weeks in the issues of May 31; June 7 and 14, 1978.

Mr. William I. Porfily, Watermaster, has filed a statement to the effect that the proposed changes in place of use and point of diversion may be made without injury to existing rights.

No objections having been filed and it appearing that the proposed changes in place of use and point of diversion may be made without injury to existing rights, the application should be approved.

NOW, THEREFORE, it hereby is ORDERED that the requested changes in place of use and point of diversion, as described herein, without loss of priority, are

approved.

It is FURTHER ORDERED that the quantity of water diverted at the new point of diversion shall not exceed the quantity of water available at the old point of diversion under the subject right.

It is FURTHER ORDERED that the following provisions shall be effective when in the judgment of the watermaster it becomes necessary to install headgates and measuring devices:

That the diversion works shall include an in line flow meter, a weir, or other suitable device for measuring the water to which the applicant is entitled;

That the type and plans of the measuring device be approved by the watermaster before the beginning of construction work and that the weir or measuring device be installed under the general supervision of said watermaster.

It is FURTHER ORDERED that NO time need be fixed for completion as the changes in place of use and point of diversion of water are completed.

It is FURTHER ORDERED that the certificate of water right recorded at page 2579, Volume 3, State Record of Water Right Certificates, is canceled; and in lieu thereof, a new certificate be issued covering the balance of the right NOT involved in this proceeding or in the proceeding approving transfer application No. 3948; and upon proof satisfactory to the Water Resources Director of completion of works and beneficial use of water to the extent intended under the provisions of this order, a confirming certificate of water right shall be issued to the applicant herein.
