ORDER REVERTING A POINT OF  
DIVERSION

**Authority**

OAR 690-380-6010(6) provides that a point of diversion or appropriation shall revert to the last authorized point of diversion or appropriation if the changes authorized under a transfer are not completed.

**Findings of Fact**

1. On December 21, 2005, John and Pamela Thennes filed a transfer application to change the point of diversion under Certificate 50485. The Department assigned the application number T-10047.
2. On May 24, 2007, the Water Resources Department issued an order approving the proposed change in point of diversion. The order was recorded in Special Order Volume 72, Pages 119-121.
3. On April 4, 2012, John and Pamela Thennes notified the Department that the change authorized under T-10047 would not be completed and requested that the authorized point of diversion for the transferred lands revert back to the original points of diversion.

**Now, therefore, it is ORDERED:**

The point of diversion authorized under Application T-10047 is reverted to the points of diversion authorized under the water right prior to the transfer. A superseding certificate for the right affected by the transfer shall be issued.
