ORDER APPROVING A CHANGE IN POINT OF DIVERSION

Pursuant to ORS 540.510 TO 540.530, after notice was given and no objections were filed, and finding that no injury to existing water rights would result, this order approves TRANSFER 5980 submitted by

WARD AND GEORGINE CADWALLADER
780 LAURELWOOD DRIVE
ROGUE RIVER, OREGON 97357

to use the waters of the ROGUE RIVER, a tributary of the PACIFIC OCEAN, for the purpose of IRRIGATING 1.0 ACRE.

The right to be transferred, as evidenced by certificate 56208, was perfected under Permit 12635 with a date of priority of MAY 7, 1937. This right is limited to 0.012 cubic foot per second, if available at the original point of diversion; LOT 1 (SE 1/4 NW 1/4), SECTION 15, T 34 S, R 1 W, W.M.; 340 FEET NORTH AND 3240 FEET WEST FROM THE EAST 1/4 CORNER OF SECTION 15, or its equivalent in case of rotation, measured at the point of diversion from the source.

The new point of diversion is located as follows:

LOT 1 (SE 1/4 NW 1/4), SECTION 15, T 34 S, R 1 W, W.M.; 930 FEET NORTH AND 510 FEET WEST FROM THE CENTER 1/4 CORNER OF SECTION 15.

The amount of water used for irrigation under this right is limited to a diversion of ONE-EIGHTIETH of one cubic foot per second (or its equivalent) and 2.5 acre-feet for each acre irrigated during the irrigation season of each year.

This right shall conform to any reasonable rotation system ordered by the proper state officer.

A description of the place of use is as follows:

Lot 1 (SE 1/4 NW 1/4) 1.0 ACRE
SECTION 15
TOWNSHIP 34 SOUTH, RANGE 1 WEST, W.M.


The right to use water for the above purpose is restricted to beneficial use on the lands or place of use described.

THIS CHANGE TO AN EXISTING WATER RIGHT MAY BE MADE PROVIDED THE FOLLOWING CONDITIONS ARE MET BY THE WATER USER:

1. The proposed change is complete. The claim of beneficial use shall be submitted in accordance with the transmittal letter.
2. The quantity of water diverted at the new point of diversion shall not exceed the quantity of water available at the original point of diversion.
3. When required by the Department, the water user shall install and maintain a headgate, an in-line flow meter, weir, or other suitable device for measuring and recording the quantity of water diverted. The type and plans of the headgate and measuring device must be approved by the Department prior to beginning construction and shall be installed under the general supervision of the Department.

Certificate 56208 is canceled. A new certificate will be issued to confirm that portion of the right NOT involved in this transfer. When satisfactory proof of the completed change is received, a new certificate confirming this water right will be issued.
