ORDER APPROVING A CHANGE IN PLACE OF USE AND POINT OF DIVERSION

Pursuant to ORS 540.510 to 540.530, after notice was given and no objections were filed, and finding that no injury to existing water rights would result, this order approves TRANSFER 6374 submitted by

SAM AND JEAN ZAVESON 266 RIVERWOOD LANE OAKLAND, OREGON 97462

to use the waters of the UMPQUA RIVER, a tributary of the PACIFIC OCEAN, for the purpose of IRRIGATING 2.71 ACRES.

The right to be transferred, as evidenced by certificate 56101, was perfected under Permit 20139 with a date of priority of MARCH 12, 1951. This right is limited to 0.034 cubic foot per second, if available at the original point of diversion: NE 1/4 SE 1/4, SECTION 20, T 23 S, R 7 W, W.M, or its equivalent in case of rotation, measured at the point of diversion from the river.

The new point of diversion is located as follows:

NE 1/4 SE 1/4, SECTION 20, TOWNSHIP 23 SOUTH, RANGE 7 WEST, W.M.; 1640 FEET NORTH AND 600 FEET WEST FROM THE SE CORNER OF SECTION 20.

The amount of water used for irrigation under this right is limited to a diversion of ONE-EIGHTIETH of one cubic foot per second (or its equivalent) and 2.5 acre-feet for each acre irrigated during the irrigation season of each year.

This right shall conform to any reasonable rotation system ordered by the proper state officer.

A description of the new place of use is as follows:

SE 1/4 SE 1/4 1.62 ACRES SECTION 20 TOWNSHIP 23 SOUTH, RANGE 7 WEST, W.M.

A description of the existing place of use is as follows:

SE 1/4 SE 1/4 1.09 ACRES SECTION 20 TOWNSHIP 23 SOUTH, RANGE 7 WEST, W.M.

The right to use water for the above purpose is restricted to beneficial use on the lands or place of use described.

THIS CHANGE TO AN EXISTING WATER RIGHT MAY BE MADE PROVIDED THE FOLLOWING CONDITIONS ARE MET BY THE WATER USER:

- 1. The proposed change shall be completed on or before October 1, 1991.
- 2. The quantity of water diverted at the new point of diversion, shall not exceed the quantity of water available at the original point of diversion.
- 3. When required by the Department, the water user shall install and maintain a headgate, an in-line flow meter, weir, or other suitable devise for measuring and recording the quantity of water diverted. The type and plans of the headgate and measuring device must be approved by the Department prior to beginning construction and shall be installed under the general supervision of the Department.
- 4. The following former place of use shall no longer be irrigated as a part of this water right:

NE 1/4 SE 1/4 1.41 ACRES
SE 1/4 SE 1/4 0.21 ACRE
SECTION 20
TOWNSHIP 23 SOUTH, RANGE 7 WEST, W.M.

Certificate 56101 is canceled. A new certificate will be issued to confirm that portion of the right NOT involved in this transfer. When satisfactory proof of the completed change is received, a new certificate confirming this water right will be issued.
