### Authority

ORS 537.348 establishes the process in which a water right holder may submit a request to lease an existing water right for instream purposes. OAR Chapter 690, Division 077 implements the statutes and provides the Department's procedures and criteria for evaluating instream lease applications.

## **Findings of Fact**

- 1. On May 28, 2014, EFID, on behalf of several water right holders, filed an application to lease a portion of Certificates 81340, 80929, and 84803 for instream use. The Department assigned the application number IL-1414.
- 2. During the review process, Department staff determined that additional information was needed to complete the evaluation. On June 27, 2014, the Department requested the application amended. On July 8, 2014, OWRD received the requested information from EFID.
- 3. On July 22, 2014, the Department identified to the Lessor that a portion of 1.24 acres of irrigation proposed to be leased under Certificate 81340 was actually under Certificate 88094. On August 13, 2014, the Department received additional information from the applicant further amending the application and requesting Certificate 88094 be included as part of Instream Lease Application IL-1414.
- 4. The first right to be leased has been modified from the lease application and is as follows:

- 5. Certificate 81340 does not specify a rate and duty limit per acre. However, the Hood River Decree limits the water right to 3 AF per acre and one-eightieth CFS per acre. The maximum rate and volume that may be diverted based on the rate and duty limit per acre are identified in the finding above.

- 7. Certificate 88094 does not specify a rate and duty limit per acre. However, the Hood River Decree limits the water right to 3 AF per acre and one-eightieth CFS per acre. The maximum rate and volume that may be diverted based on the rate and duty limit per acre are identified in the finding above.

- 10. The Certificates identified in this instream lease application do not specify the irrigation season. However, the Hood River Decree describes the irrigation season as April 1 through September 30.
- 11. The lease application includes the information required under OAR 690-077-0076(3). The Department provided notice of the lease application on June 3, 2014, pursuant to OAR 690-077-0077(1). No comments were received.
- 12. Due to the inclusion of Certificate 88094 to Instream Lease Application IL-1414, the Department re-noticed the application in the Departments weekly notice on August 12, 2014 pursuant to OAR 690-077-0077(1). No comments were received.
- 13. The instream use is as follows:

East Fork Hood River, tributary to Hood River

14. Other conditions to prevent injury and enlargement are:

Within the specified stream reach, the amount of water to which this right is entitled shall not exceed the quantity of water legally available at the original point of diversion. Stream channel losses and gains calculated based on available data and the use of water by senior appropriators will determine the amount of water to which this right is entitled downstream from the original points of diversion within the specified stream reach.

- 15. The amount and timing of the proposed instream flow is allowable within the limits and use of the original water rights.
- 16. The protection of flows within the proposed reach is appropriate, considering:
  - a. The instream water use begins at the recorded point of diversion;

- b. The location of confluences with other streams downstream of the point of diversion.
- c. There are no known areas of natural loss of streamflow to the river bed downstream from the point of diversion; and
- d. Any return flows resulting from the exercise of the existing water right would re-enter the river downstream of the reach of the instream water right.
- 17. The total monthly quantities of water to be protected under the existing and proposed instream rights in the reach will provide for a beneficial purpose.
- 18. The total monthly quantities of water to be protected instream under existing and proposed instream rights in the reach do not exceed the estimated average natural flow.
- 19. If approved, this instream lease is not reasonably expected to significantly affect land use as prescribed by ORS 197.180, OAR Chapter 660, Divisions 30 and 31, and OAR Chapter 690, Division 5.
- 20. Based upon review of the application, information provided by the Department's Watermaster, and other available information, the Department finds that the lease will not result in injury or enlargement. The order approving this instream lease may be modified or revoked under OAR 690-077-0077 if the Department later finds that the lease is causing injury to any existing water right or enlargement of the original right.
- 21. If a right which has been leased is later proposed to be leased again, transferred and/or reviewed for an allocation of conserved water, a new injury review shall be required. For example, instream transfers will be subject to a full and complete review to determine consistency with the requirements of OAR Chapter 690, Division 380 and Division 077. Approval of this lease does not establish a precedent for approval of any future transactions.
- 22. The Lessors have requested that the lease terminate on September 30, 2016. The lease may commence on the date this final order is signed.
- 23. The Lessors have requested the option of terminating the lease early with written notice to the Department.

#### **Conclusions of Law**

The Department concludes that the lease will not result in injury or enlargement, OAR 690-077-0077. The lease conforms to the applicable provisions of OAR 690-077-0015.

### Now, therefore it is ORDERED:

- 1. The Lease as described herein is APPROVED.
- 2. During each year of the term of the lease, the former place of use will no longer receive water as part of these rights, any supplemental rights, or any other layered irrigation water rights, including ground water registrations and permits.

3. The term of the lease will commence upon approval of the instream lease and terminate on September 30, 2016. For multiyear leases, the lessors shall have the option of terminating the lease any time each year with written notice to the Department. However, if the termination request is received less than 30-days prior to the instream use period (June 1 through September 30) or after the water rights' original period of allowed use has begun, the Department may issue an order terminating the lease but use of water may not be allowed until the following calendar year, unless the Director determines that enlargement would not occur.
