ORDER APPROVING A CHANGE IN POINT OF DIVERSION

Pursuant to ORS 540.510 to 540.530, after notice was given and no objections were filed, and finding that no injury to existing water rights would result, this order approves, as conditioned or limited herein, TRANSFER 6706 submitted by

LAVERNE E. AND MARTHA S. PEARSON c/o ROBERT T. MAUTZ P.O. BOX 628 PENDLETON, OREGON 97801.

The right to be modified, as evidenced by Certificate 14384, was perfected under Permit 12309 with a date of priority of AUGUST 14, 1936. The right allows the use of MCKAY CREEK, a tributary of the UMATILLA RIVER, for IRRIGATION OF 8.0 ACRES. This right is limited to 0.10 cubic foot per second, if available at the authorized point of diversion: NE¼ NW¼, SECTION 21, T 2 N, R 32 E, WM, or its equivalent in case of rotation, measured at the point of diversion from the source.

The amount of water used for irrigation under this right is limited to a diversion of ONE-EIGHTIETH of one cubic foot per second (or its equivalent) and 3.0 acre-feet for each acre irrigated during the irrigation season of each year.

The use shall conform to any reasonable rotation system ordered by the proper state officer.

The authorized place of use is located as follows:

NW¼ NW¼ 8.0 ACRES SECTION 16 TOWNSHIP 2 NORTH, RANGE 32 EAST, W.M.

The right to use the water for the above purpose is restricted to beneficial use on the lands or place of use described.

The applicant proposes to change the point of diversion to:

 $NW^{\frac{1}{4}}$, NW $^{\frac{1}{4}}$, SECTION 16, T 2 N, R 32 E, WM; 700 FEET SOUTH AND 800 FEET EAST FROM THE NW CORNER OF SECTION 16.

THIS CHANGE TO AN EXISTING WATER RIGHT MAY BE MADE PROVIDED THE FOLLOWING CONDITIONS ARE MET BY THE WATER USER:

- 1. The proposed change shall be completed on or before October 1, 1994.
- 2. The quantity of water diverted at the new point of diversion shall not exceed the quantity of water available at the original point of diversion.

3. The water user shall install and maintain a headgate, an in-line flow meter, weir, or other suitable device for measuring and recording the quantity of water diverted. The type and plans of the headgate and measuring device must be approved by the Department prior to beginning construction and shall be installed under the general supervision of the Department.

Certificate 14384 is cancelled. When satisfactory proof of the completed change is received, a new certificate confirming this water right will be issued.
