O R D E R

APPROVING APPLICATION

On January 13, 1939, O. W. Eastham, as attorney for Opal Jarvis, filed application for an extension of time within which to complete the inchoate water right awarded to George W. Turner and Mildred S. Turner.

By decree of the Circuit Court for Douglas County, dated August 14, 1930, in the matter of the determination of the relative rights to the use of the waters of Cow Creek and its tributaries, a tributary of the Umpqua River, an inchoate water right was recognized in the name of George W. Turner and Mildred S. Turner for the irrigation of 30 acres through the Cow Creek Irrigation Company's ditch, with a date of priority of 1902. The time limit within which to apply the water to beneficial use under said right was fixed as August 14, 1932, which time may, upon good cause shown, be extended upon application made to the State Engineer.

Time for the completion of such inchoate water right, as extended from time to time, expired December 31, 1938. The applicant herein, as successor-in-interest to George W. Turner and Mildred S. Turner, requests that said time be extended to December 31, 1939.

Notice of filing application for extension of time was given by registered mail to the Cow Creek Irrigation Company and all individuals having water rights through the ditch being operated by said company.

No objections having been filed against the granting of an extension of time as requested by applicant herein, it appears that such application should be approved.

NOW, THEREFORE, it hereby is ORDERED that the application for an extension of time be and the same hereby is granted and the time for the completion of such an inchoate water right be fixed as December 31, 1939.
