Authority

ORS 540.505 to 540.580 establishes the process in which a water right holder may submit a request to transfer the point of diversion, place of use, or character of use authorized under an existing water right. OAR Chapter 690, Division 380 implements the statutes and provides the Department's procedures and criteria for evaluating transfer applications.

Findings of Fact

1. On July 3, 2013, Mark L. and Julie A. Winton filed an application to change the points of diversion under Certificate 74050. The Department assigned the application number T-11632.
2. Notice of the application for transfer was published on July 9, 2013, pursuant to OAR 690-380-4000. No comments were filed in response to the notice.
3. Transfer Application T-11632 proposed to modify water rights within the boundaries of Lower Powder Irrigation District. The district was notified of the proposed temporary transfer and indicated that the district did not object to the transfer.
4. Transfer Application T-11632 proposes transfer water rights served by a Bureau of Reclamation storage project. The Bureau was notified of the proposed transfer and did not provide any comments.

This final order is subject to judicial review by the Court of Appeals under ORS 183.482. Any petition for judicial review must be filed within the 60-day time period specified by ORS 183.482(1). Pursuant to ORS 536.075 and OAR 137-003-0675, you may petition for judicial review or petition the Director for reconsideration of this order. A petition for reconsideration may be granted or denied by the Director, and if no action is taken within 60 days following the date the petition was filed, the petition shall be deemed denied.

5. On December 24, 2013, the Department sent a copy of the Draft Preliminary Determination proposing to approve Transfer Application T-11632 to the applicants. The Preliminary Determination cover letter set forth a deadline of January 24, 2014, for the applicants to respond. The applicants requested that the Department proceed with issuance of a Preliminary Determination and provided the necessary information to demonstrate that the applicants are authorized to pursue the transfer.
6. On March 3, 2014, the Department issued a Preliminary Determination proposing to approve Transfer Application T-11632 and sent a copy to the applicants. Additionally, notice of the Preliminary Determination for the transfer application was published on the Department's weekly notice on March 11, 2014, and in the Baker City Herald newspaper on March 14 and 21, 2014, pursuant to ORS 540.520 and OAR 690-380-4020. No protests were filed in response to the notices.
7. The portion of the first right to be transferred is as follows:

Certificate: 74050 in the name of U.S. BUREAU OF RECLAMATION (perfected under Permit S-11092)

Use: IRRIGATION OF 127.0 ACRES

Priority Date: NOVEMBER 4, 1933

Rate: 2.15 CFS from POD No. 2 and 1.02 CFS from a combination of POD No. 6 and POD No. 8

Limit/Duty: The amount of water used for irrigation, together with the amount secured under any other right existing for the same lands, is limited to a diversion of ONE-FORTIETH of one cubic foot per second per acre, from direct flow, or its equivalent for each acre irrigated during the irrigation season from April 1, to October 1 of each year.

Source: POWDER RIVER, tributary of the SNAKE RIVER INCLUDING WATER STORED IN THIEF VALLEY RESERVOIR, CONSTRUCTED UNDER PERMIT R-667 A TRIBUTARY OF POWDER RIVER.

8. Transfer Application T-11632 proposes to move the authorized points of diversion downstream approximately 13.4 miles from the Bache ditch, 8.0 miles from the Old Perkins Ditch and 7.5 miles from the Perkins Ditch to:

9. The Oregon Department of Fish and Wildlife (ODFW) determined that a fish screen is necessary at the new point of diversion to prevent fish from entering the diversion and that the diversion is not currently equipped with an appropriate fish screen. Listed fish species are not present at the point of diversion, the originating water right diversion is not screened, cost-share funds are not currently available, and the proposed diversion may be eligible for ODFW's cost-share program. A grace period of two years is appropriate until such time as cost-share funds become available to assist in the construction of a fish screen. If cost-share funds do not become available, the water user must screen within the indicated time period regardless of the availability of cost-share funding.

Transfer Review Criteria [OAR 690-380-4010(2)]

10. Water has been used within the last five years according to the terms and conditions of the right. There is no information in the record that would demonstrate that the right is subject to forfeiture under ORS 540.610.
11. A diversion structure and ditch sufficient to use the full amount of water allowed under the existing right was present within the five-year period prior to submittal of Transfer Application T-11632.
12. The proposed change would not result in enlargement of the right.
13. The proposed change would not result in injury to other water rights.

Conclusions of Law


The change in points of diversion proposed in Transfer Application T-11632 is consistent with the requirements of ORS 540.505 to 540.580 and OAR 690-380-5000.

Now, therefore, it is **ORDERED**:

1. The change in points of diversion proposed in Transfer Application T-11632 is approved.
2. The right to the use of the water is restricted to beneficial use at the place of use described, and is subject to all other conditions and limitations contained in Certificate 74050 and any related decree.
3. Water right certificate 74050 is modified. The Department will issue a superseding certificate describing the right when it determines that is necessary for record keeping. The perfected portion of Certificate 74050 is reduced by 127.0 acres
4. The quantity of water diverted at the new point of diversion, shall not exceed the quantity of water lawfully available at the original points of diversion.
5. Water use measurement conditions:
 - a. **Before water use may begin** under this order, the water user shall install a totalizing flow meter, or, with prior approval of the Director, another suitable measuring device, at each point of diversion at the new point of diversion.
 - b. The water user shall maintain the meter in good working order.
 - c. The water user shall allow the Watermaster access to the meter; provided however, where the meter is located within a private structure, the Watermaster shall request access upon reasonable notice.
6. Within two years after the date of this order the water user shall install an approved fish screen at the new point of diversion. The water user may withdraw water at the new point of diversion without a screen until then. The water user shall provide to OWRD a written statement from Oregon Department of Fish and Wildlife (ODFW) that the installed screen meets the state's criteria, or that ODFW has determined a screen is not necessary. The water user shall maintain and operate the fish screen at the new point of diversion consistent with ODFW's operational and maintenance standards. If ODFW determines the screen is not functioning properly, and is unsuccessful in working with the water user to meet ODFW standards, ODFW may request that OWRD regulate the use of water until OWRD receives notification from ODFW that the fish screen is functioning properly.
7. Full beneficial use of the water shall be made, consistent with the terms of this order, on or before **October 1, 2015**. A Claim of Beneficial Use prepared by a Certified Water Right Examiner shall be submitted by the applicant to the Department within one year after the deadline for completion of the change and full beneficial use of the water.

8. After satisfactory proof of beneficial use is received, a new certificate, in the name of U.S. Bureau of Reclamation, confirming the right transferred will be issued.
