ORDER APPROVING CHANGES IN USE, PLACE OF USE, AND POINTS OF DIVERSION

Pursuant to ORS 540.510 to 540.530, after notice was given and no objections were filed, and finding that no injury to existing water rights would result, this order approves, as conditioned or limited herein, TRANSFER 7526 submitted by

WILLAMETTE INDUSTRIES, INC. P.O. BOX 339 ALBANY, OREGON 97321.

The first right to be modified, as evidenced by a portion of Certificate 68559, was perfected under Permit 14106 with a date of priority of NOVEMBER 2, 1939. The right allows the use of ROW RIVER, a tributary of the COAST FORK WILLAMETTE RIVER, for LOG DECK SPRINKLING. The amount of water to which this right is entitled is limited to an amount actually beneficially used and shall not exceed 1.93 cubic foot per second, if available at the authorized point of diversion: NW¼ SW¼, SECTION 30, T 21 S, R 1 W, WM; 30 FEET SOUTH AND 30 WEST FROM THE SW CORNER LOT 3 (SE¼ NW¼), SECTION 30, or its equivalent in case of rotation, measured at the point of diversion from the source.

The second right to be modified, as evidenced by a portion of Certificate 20829, was perfected under Permit 20469 with a date of priority of JUNE 11, 1943. The right allows the use of CULP CREEK, a tributary of the ROW RIVER, for MANUFACTURING. The amount of water to which this right is entitled is limited to an amount actually beneficially used and shall not exceed 2.0 cubic foot per second, water to be diverted from Culp Creek when available and any deficiency in the available supply in Culp Creek to be made up by diversion from the Row River, if available at the authorized points of diversion: NW¼ SW¼, SECTION 32, and NE¼ SE¼, SECTION 31, T 21 S, R 1 W, WM, or its equivalent in case of rotation, measured at the point of diversion from the source.

The third right to be modified, as evidenced by a portion of Certificate 20873, was perfected under Permit 20514 with a date of priority of JANUARY 23, 1951. The right allows the use of CULP CREEK, a tributary of the ROW RIVER, for MANUFACTURING. The amount of water to which this right is entitled is limited to an amount actually beneficially used and shall not exceed 1.20 cubic foot per second, water to be diverted from Culp Creek when available and any deficiency in the available supply in Culp Creek to be made up by diversion from the Row River, if available at the authorized points of diversion: NE% SE%, SECTION 31, from Culp Creek; and NW% SW%, SECTION 32, from the Row River; both in T 21 S, R 1 W, WM, or its equivalent in case of rotation, measured at the point of diversion from the source.

The use shall conform to any reasonable rotation system ordered by the proper state officer.

The right to use the water for the above purpose is restricted to beneficial use on the lands or place of use described

The applicant proposes to change the place of use to:

TOWNSHIP 10 SOUTH, RANGE 3 WEST, W.M.

The applicant proposes to change the use of the rights to INDUSTRIAL USE.

The applicant proposes to change the point of diversion to:

NE¼ NE¼, as projected within POWELL DLC 44, SECTION 32, T 10 S, R 3 W, WM; 1180 FEET SOUTH AND 1220 FEET WEST FROM THE NE CORNER, SECTION 32.

The portions of the right evidenced by Certificate 20829 for use of water stored in the reservoir constructed under Permit R-1179, and for use of water from Culp Creek and the Row River for maintenance of the log pond have been voluntarily abandoned by the applicant. The entire quantity of water from Culp Creek and the Row River has been used for manufacturing.

The portions of the right evidence by Certificate 20873 for use of water stored in the reservoir constructed under Permit R-1204, and for use of water from Culp Creek and the Row River for maintenance of the log ponds and domestic use have been voluntarily abandoned by the applicant. The entire quantity of water from Culp Creek and the Row River has been used for manufacturing.

THESE CHANGES TO EXISTING WATER RIGHTS MAY BE MADE PROVIDED THE FOLLOWING CONDITIONS ARE MET BY THE WATER USER:

- 1. The proposed changes shall be completed on or before October 1, 2000
- 2. The quantity of water diverted at the new point of diversion, together with that diverted at the old points of diversion, shall not exceed the quantity of water lawfully available at the original points of diversion.
- 3. When required by the Department, the water user shall install and maintain a headgate, an in-line flow meter, weir, or other suitable device for measuring and recording the quantity of water diverted. The type and plans of the headgate and measuring device must be approved by the Department prior to beginning construction and shall be installed under the general supervision of the Department.

- 4. When required by the Department, the water user shall operate and maintain the headgate and measuring device, as needed. The water user shall report total flow figures when requested by the Watermaster. The Watermaster may operate the headgate and monitor the accuracy of the measuring device, as needed.
- 5. When required by the Department, the water user shall install and maintain a suitable device for measuring and recording the quantity of water available at the original points of diversion. The type and plans of the measuring device must be approved by the Department prior to beginning construction and shall be installed under the general supervision of the Department.
- 6. Water shall be acquired from the same surface water sources as the original points of diversion.
- 7. The former places of use shall no longer use water as part of these water rights.
- 8. The water user shall install and maintain a fish screen or fish by-pass device. The type and plans of the screen or by-pass device must be approved by the Oregon Department of Fish and Wildlife prior to beginning of construction and shall be installed under the supervision of the Department of Fish and Wildlife.

Certificates 68559, 20829, and 20873 are canceled. When satisfactory proof of the completed changes is received, new certificates confirming these water rights will be issued.
