ORDER

EXTENDING TIME LIMITS

The South Fork Water Commission of Oregon City, Oregon is the holder of Permit No. 22581 for the appropriation of not to exceed 60.0 second feet of water from the Clackamas River for domestic and municipal use within the area served by the Commission which includes the cities of Oregon City, West Linn, and adjacent area.


The Commission has advised the State Engineer that they have been proceeding with studies to determine whether or not the most economical means to obtain the water would be by construction of a filter plant and use of water under this permit, or to extend their existing system on the South Fork of the Clackamas River. The Commission advises that this study has nearly been completed and that it is their desire to maintain this permit in good standing until the study is completed and, if proven economically sound, to proceed with the development.

It appears that the preservation of the rights set out in the permit is consistent with the public interest, and

IT IS THEREFORE HEREBY ORDERED that the time limits under Permit No. 22581 be and the same hereby are extended as follows:

- Until January 22, 1958 for beginning of construction
- Until October 1, 1958 for completion of construction
- Until October 1, 1959 for complete application of water.
