ORDER APPROVING A CHANGE IN POINT OF DIVERSION

Pursuant to ORS 540.510 to 540.531, after notice was given and no objections were filed, and finding that no injury to existing water rights would result, this order approves, as conditioned or limited herein, TRANSFER 6671 submitted by

WILLIAM A. AND BLANCHE PATTERSON HCR 56 BOX 20 JOHN DAY, OREGON 97845.

The right to be modified, as evidenced by a portion of Certificate 66805, was confirmed by decree of the Circuit Court of the State of Oregon for GRANT County. The decree is on record at Salem, in the Order Record of the WATER RESOURCES DIRECTOR, in Volume 15, at Page 461. The date of priority is 1889. The right allows the use of the JOHN DAY RIVER, a tributary of the COLUMBIA RIVER, for IRRIGATION OF 4.5 ACRES AND STOCK WATER.

The point of diversion is located in the NE% NE%, SECTION 25, T 13 S, R 31 E, W.M.; TROWBRIDGE DITCH; 2150 FEET NORTH AND 920 FEET WEST FROM THE E% CORNER OF SECTION 25.

The amount of water used for irrigation, together with the amount secured under an other right existing for the same lands, is limited to ONE-FORTIETH of one cubic foot per second per acre IRRIGATED FROM APRIL 1 TO SEPTEMBER 30 (or its equivalent); and IS FURTHER LIMITED TO ONE ACRE-FOOT for each acre irrigated PER CALENDAR MONTH TO JULY 1 AND 3/4 ACRE-FOOT PER ACRE THEREAFTER; TOTAL FIVE ACRE-FEET PER ACRE FOR THE SEASON, MEASURED AT THE POINT OF DIVERSION during the irrigation season of each year.

The use shall conform to any reasonable rotation system ordered by the proper state officer.

The authorized place of use is located as follows:

TRACT 4

SE% NW% 4.5 ACRES
SECTION 22
TOWNSHIP 13 SOUTH, RANGE 31 EAST, W.M.

The right to use the water for the above purpose is restricted to beneficial use on the lands or place of use described.

Special Order Volume 51, Page 324 .

The applicant proposes to change the point of diversion to:

NE% SW%, SECTION 22, T 13 S, R 31 E, W.M.; 2000 FEET NORTH AND 2600 FEET EAST FROM THE SW CORNER, SECTION 22.

THIS CHANGE TO AN EXISTING WATER RIGHT MAY BE MADE PROVIDED THE FOLLOWING CONDITIONS ARE MET BY THE WATER USER:

- 1. The proposed change shall be completed on or before October 1, 1998.
- The quantity of water diverted at the new point of diversion, together with that diverted at the old point of diversion, shall not exceed the quantity of water lawfully available at the original point of diversion. The new point of diversion shall be regulated with other diversions on the John Day River
- 3. When required by the Department, the water user shall install and maintain a headgate, an in-line flow meter, weir, or other suitable device for measuring and recording the quantity of water diverted. When measuring devices are required on the upper mainstem of the John Day River, they will be required on the pond. The type and plans of the headgate and measuring device must be approved by the Department prior to beginning construction and shall be installed under the general supervision of the Department.
- 4. Water shall be acquired from the same surface water source as the original point of diversion.

Certificate 66805 is cancelled. A new certificate will be issued to confirm that portion of the right NOT involved in this transfer. When satisfactory proof of the completed change is received, a new certificate confirming this water right will be issued.
