ORDER APPROVING A CHANGE IN POINT OF DIVERSION

Pursuant to ORS 540.510 to 540.530, after notice was given and no objections were filed, and finding that no injury to existing water rights would result, this order approves TRANSFER 6230 submitted by

DENNIS AND SHARON A. DAVIS  
4915 S.W. RIVER ROAD  
HILLSBORO, OR 97123

to use the waters of the TUALATIN RIVER, a tributary of the WILLAMETTE RIVER, for IRRIGATING 3.76 ACRES.

The right to be transferred, as evidenced by Certificate 23092, was perfected under Permit 22028 with a date of priority of FEBRUARY 11, 1953. This right is limited to 0.05 cubic foot per second, if available at the original point of diversion: NW 1/4 SE 1/4, AS PROJECTED WITHIN DLC 61, SECTION 16, T 1 S, R 2 W, W.M.; 650 FEET SOUTH AND 2350 FEET WEST FROM THE E 1/4 CORNER OF SECTION 16., or its equivalent in case of rotation, measured at the point of diversion from the source.

The new point of diversion is located as follows:

SW 1/4 NE 1/4, AS PROJECTED WITHIN DLC 61, SECTION 16, T 1 S, R 2 W, W.M.; 220 FEET NORTH AND 2305 FEET WEST FROM THE E 1/4 CORNER OF SECTION 16.

The amount of water used for irrigation under this right is limited to a diversion of ONE-EIGHTIETH of one cubic foot per second (or its equivalent) and 2.5 acre-feet for each acre irrigated during the irrigation season of each year.

The use shall conform to any reasonable rotation system ordered by the proper state officer.

A description of the place of use is as follows:

SW 1/4 NE 1/4            3.76 ACRES  
AS PROJECTED WITHIN DLC 61  
SECTION 16  
TOWNSHIP 1 SOUTH, RANGE 2 WEST, W.M.


The right to use the water for the above purpose is restricted to beneficial use on the lands or place of use described.

THIS CHANGE TO AN EXISTING WATER RIGHT MAY BE MADE PROVIDED THE FOLLOWING CONDITIONS ARE MET BY THE WATER USER:

1. The proposed change shall be completed on or before October 1, 1992.
2. The quantity of water diverted at the new point of diversion shall not exceed the quantity of water available at the original point of diversion.
3. When required by the Department, the water user shall install and maintain a headgate, an in-line flow meter, weir, or other suitable device for measuring and recording the quantity of water diverted. The type and plans of the headgate and measuring device must be approved by the Department prior to beginning construction and shall be installed under the general supervision of the Department.

Certificate 23092 is canceled. A new certificate will be issued to confirm that portion of the right NOT involved in this transfer. When satisfactory proof of the completed change is received, a new certificate confirming this water right will be issued.
