O R D E R

W. O. Hadley on August 9th, 1933 filed with the State Engineer application No. 15076 to secure a permit to appropriate 10 cubic feet per second of water from Oak Springs, tributaries of Deschutes River. It was stated that the applicant intends to use the water for fish propagation and domestic use.


The Oregon State Game Commission protested the application and the matter was set for hearing on Friday, November 10, 1933 at The Dalles, Oregon. At said hearing a dispute arose between the parties as to the location of said springs, the protestants contending that certain springs were not on the land of applicants.

The protestant agreed that if the applicant would state in his application that all the springs described in the application from which the applicant intended to appropriate the water were located on the applicant's land that the protest would be withdrawn.

The applicant agreeing to include a statement as requested in the application and such restriction being placed therein to the satisfaction of the parties;

It is ORDERED that the protest be dismissed and the application, No. 15706, in the name of W. O. Hadley, be approved.
