Findings of Fact

- 1. On January 2, 2013, the Department issued a final order, recorded in Special Order Volume 88, Pages 844 848, approving Transfer Application T-11476. The order established October 1, 2014, as the date for completion of the authorized changes in place of use.
- 2. On September 17, 2015, the Department received a Claim of Beneficial Use (CBU) and associated maps for Transfer Application T-11476, from the applicant.
- 3. On January 25, 2016, the Department issued a final order for Determination of Satisfactory Proof under transfer T-11476, which was mailed on January 29, 2016 and recorded in Special Order Volume 98, Pages 651-652. This order contains a scrivener's error in the location of the reconfigured place of use described in Finding of Fact #4 of the original order.
- 4. This superseding and correcting order is being issued to the correct the scrivener's error in the Determination of Satisfactory Proof under transfer T-11476 as recorded in Special Order Volume 98, Pages 651-652. Corrections are noted in **bold** in Findings of Facts #6 and #8, below.
- 5. The CBU did not contain a map of the point of diversion from the source. However, since the transfer involved the transfer of places of use only within an irrigation district and did

not involve a change in the point of diversion, the existing maps on file with the Department are sufficient to identify the point of diversion from the source.

6. The CBU and associated maps for a portion of this transfer illustrate a portion of the authorized place of use change was proved up on slightly differently than authorized. This change is described further in the tables below:

- 8. The reconfigured changes in place of use as mapped and described above are determined satisfactory because the reconfiguration is within the same tax lot, does not enlarge the rights, and the water right holder remains the same.
- 9. Satisfactory proof of the changes was submitted with evidence showing that water was used in the location and for the purpose as authorized by the final order approving Transfer Application T-11476.

Conclusions of Law

Pursuant to ORS 540.530and OAR 690-385-7600, the Department may issue or modify a certificate upon a determination the application of water to beneficial use under the terms of the final order approving a permanent district transfer was completed to the extend authorized.

Now, therefore, it is ORDERED:

1. The order entered at Special Order Volume 98, Pages 651-652 is withdrawn and of no further force and effect and is superseded by this order.

- 2. The water has been applied to beneficial use to the extent authorized under the terms of the final order approving Transfer Application T-11476.
- 3. Water right certificates 83571 and 76714 are modified. The Department shall issue water right certificates on a determination that it is necessary to produce certificates describing the water rights.
