ORDER APPROVING APPLICATION

On February 7, 1934, the Underwood Lumber Company, a corporation, of Lakeview, Oregon filed an application for the approval of a change in use and point of diversion of water from Deadman Creek.

It appears that by decree of the court for Lake County, dated May 15, 1923, a water right was recognized in the name of H. W. Drenkle for the irrigation of 40 acres in the NW¹/₄SW¹/₄, Section 15, Township 39 South, Range 20 East, W. M., from Deadman Creek with a date of priority of November 28, 1876, through an unnamed ditch, the point of diversion of such ditch being located 1450 feet north and 1910 feet east from the southwest corner of Section 15, same township and range.

The applicant herein proposes to change the use of water from the irrigation of 10.15 acres of the above described tract to the filling of a log pond in connection with saw mill operation and to change the point of diversion to a point located north 27° 25' east 1321 feet from the southwest corner of Section 15, Township 39 South, Range 20 East, W. M.

Notice for publication, as provided by Section 47-712, Oregon Code 1930, was published in the Lake County Tribune and Silver Lake Leader, a newspaper having general circulation in Lake County, for a period of at least three weeks and not less than one publication each week, in the issues of February 15, February 22, March 1 and March 8, 1934. No objections having been filed, it appears that such change in character of use and point of diversion of water can be made without injury to existing rights.

Now therefore, it is hereby ORDERED that the application of the Underwood Lumber Company, a corporation, for the approval of a change in use and point of diversion of water be and the same is hereby approved.

It is further ORDERED that the use of water for the filling of the long pond in connection with saw mill operation shall be limited to a continuous flow of .25375 of one second foot, and the total quantity diverted shall not exceed 7.8125 acre feet during any period of thirty days prior to June 1st, and 5.075 acre feet during any period of thirty days after June 1st, of each year; and shall not exceed 25.375 acre feet during any irrigation season.
