ORDER APPROVING AN ADDITIONAL POINT OF APPROPRIATION

Pursuant to ORS 537.705, after notice was given and no objections were filed, and finding that no injury to existing water rights would result, this order approves, as conditioned or limited herein, TRANSFER 6628 submitted by

FORREST BRENT AND YVONNE C. CARROLL
ROUTE 2 BOX 140
MILTON FREEWATER, OREGON 97862.

The right to be modified, as evidenced by Certificate 24681, was perfected under Permit G-U-458 with a date of priority of JUNE 2, 1952. The right allows the use of MAY'S WELL, in the JOHNSON CREEK BASIN, for SUPPLEMENTAL IRRIGATION OF 18.6 ACRES. The amount of water to which this right is entitled is limited to an amount actually beneficially used and shall not exceed 0.23 cubic foot per second, if available at the original well; SW 1/4 SE 1/4, SECTION 24, T 6 N, R 34 E, W.M.; 800 FEET NORTH AND 1330 FEET WEST FROM THE SOUTHEAST CORNER, SECTION 24, or its equivalent in case of rotation, measured at the well.

The second right to be modified, as evidenced by Certificate 27424, was perfected under Permit G-1279 with a date of priority of March 2, 1959. The right allows the use of A WELL, in the WALLA WALLA RIVER BASIN, for IRRIGATION OF 19.5 ACRES. The amount of water to which this right is entitled is limited to an amount actually beneficially used and shall not exceed 0.24 cubic foot per second, if available at the original well; SW 1/4 SE 1/4, Section 24, T 6 N, R 34 E, W.M.; 800 FEET NORTH AND 1330 FEET WEST FROM THE SOUTHEAST CORNER, SECTION 24, or its equivalent in case of rotation, measured at the well.

The amount of water used for irrigation, together with the amount secured under any other right existing on the same lands, is limited to ONE-EIGHTIETH of one cubic foot per second per acre, or its equivalent for each acre irrigated and shall be further limited to a diversion of not to exceed 3 acre-feet per acre for each acre irrigated during the irrigation season of each year.

The use shall conform to any reasonable rotation system ordered by the proper state officer.

The authorized place of use is as follows:

The use may be regulated if analysis of data available discloses that the appropriation will measurably reduce the surface water flows necessary to maintain the free-flowing character of a scenic waterway in quantities necessary for recreation, fish and wildlife in effect as of the priority date of this right or as those quantities may be reduced.

The right to use water for the above purpose is restricted to beneficial use on the lands or place of use described.

The applicant proposes to add an additional point of appropriation to: SW $\frac{1}{4}$ SE $\frac{1}{4}$, Section 24, T 6 N, R 34 E, W.M.; 65 feet North and 65 Feet East from the S $\frac{1}{4}$ Corner, Section 24.

The right to use water for the above purpose is restricted to beneficial use on the lands or place of use described.

If substantial interference with an existing water right occurs due to withdrawal of water from the new point of appropriation, the use of water from the new well may be discontinued or reduced to mitigate the interference.

THIS CHANGE TO AN EXISTING WATER RIGHT MAY BE MADE PROVIDED THE FOLLOWING CONDITIONS ARE MET BY THE WATER USER:

1. The proposed change is reported to be complete.
2. The quantity of water diverted at the new point of appropriation (well), together with the quantity diverted at the old point of appropriation, shall not exceed the quantity of water lawfully available from the original point of appropriation.
3. When required by the Department the water user shall install an in-line flow meter or other suitable device for measuring and recording the quantity of water used. The type and plans of the measuring device must be approved by the Department prior to beginning construction and shall be

installed under the general supervision of the Department.

4. Water shall be acquired from the same aquifer as the original point of appropriation.

Certificates 24681 and 27424 are cancelled. When satisfactory proof of the completed change is received, a new certificate confirming these water rights will be issued.
