ORDER APPROVING TRANSFER NO. 4232

On June 1, 1979, an application was filed in the office of the Water Resources Director by Dorothy B. Willyerd for approval of a change in point of diversion, pursuant to the provisions of ORS 540.510 to 540.530.

The certificate recorded at page 33095, Volume 25, State Record of Water Right Certificates, in the name of Vern Hiskey, describes a right which includes the use of not to exceed 0.07 cubic foot per second from Abiqua Creek for irrigation of a certain 5.4 acres in NE<sup>1</sup><sub>4</sub> NW<sup>1</sup><sub>4</sub> and 0.2 acre in NW<sup>1</sup><sub>4</sub> NW<sup>1</sup><sub>4</sub> of Section 30, Township 6 South, Range 1 East, W.M., with a date of priority of May 26, 1961.

The authorized point of diversion for said right is located 560 feet South and 10 feet West from the North Quarter Corner of Section 30, being within the  $NE_4^1$   $NW_4^1$  of Section 30, Township 6 South, Range 1 East, W.M.

The applicant herein, owner of the lands above described, proposes to change the point of diversion therefrom, without loss of priority, to a point located 100 feet North and 1625 feet East from the Southwest Corner of Section 19, being within the  $SE_4^{1}$   $SW_4^{1}$  of Section 19, Township 6 South, Range 1 East, W.M.

Notice of the application, pursuant to ORS 540.520(2), was published in the Oregon Statesman, a newspaper printed and having general circulation in Marion County, Oregon, for a period of three weeks in the issues of June 28; July 5 and 12, 1979.

Mr. Clifton R. King, Watermaster, has filed a statement to the effect that the proposed change in point of diversion may be made without injury to existing rights.

No objections having been filed and it appearing that the proposed change in point of diversion may be made without injury to existing rights, the application should be approved.

NOW, THEREFORE, it hereby is ORDERED that the requested change in point of diversion, as described herein, without loss of priority, is approved.

It is FURTHER ORDERED that the quantity of water diverted at the new point of diversion shall not exceed the quantity of water available at the old point of diversion under the subject right.

It is FURTHER ORDERED that the following provisions shall be effective when in the judgment of the watermaster it becomes necessary to install headgates and measuring devices:

That the diversion works shall include an in line flow meter, a weir, or other suitable device for measuring the water to which the applicant is entitled;

That the type and plans of the measuring device be approved by the watermaster before the beginning of construction work and that the weir or measuring device be installed under the general supervision of said watermaster.

It is FURTHER ORDERED that NO time need be fixed for completion as the change in point of diversion is completed.

The order of the Water Resources Director entered May 14, 1979, approving transfer No. 4169, provided for cancellation of the certificate recorded at page 33095, Volume 25, State Record of Water Right Certificates, and issuance of a new certificate covering the balance of the right NOT involved in the transfer proceedings; therefore,

It is FURTHER ORDERED that the portion of the right involved in the change authorized herein NOT be included in the new certificate to be issued as provided by the order entered May 14, 1979, approving transfer No. 4169; and upon proof satisfactory to the Water Resources Director of completion of works and beneficial use of water to the extent intended under the provisions of this order, a confirming certificate of water right shall be issued to the applicant herein.
