ORDER

On January 20, 1978, Ruth E. Bacon submitted an affidavit that she is the owner of certain water rights and the lands to which the water rights are appurtenant; that she has abandoned any and all interest in and to the said water rights and request the same be canceled.

The water rights in question are: (a) a portion of the right described by the certificate recorded at Page 7578, Volume 7, State Record of Water Right Certificates, in the name of John Phipps, with a date of priority of June 25, 1924, for the use of 0.02 cubic foot of water per second from Dugger Creek for the irrigation of 1.55 acres in the SW4 NW4 of Section 30, Township 6 North, Range 35 East, W. M., and (b) a portion of the right described by the certificate recorded at Page 33483, Volume 25, State Record of Water Right Certificates, in the names of Carl L. and Anita J. Harris, with a date of priority of April 18, 1963, for the use of 0.02 cubic foot of water per second from Well #2 for the irrigation of 1.55 acres in the SW4 NW4 of Section 30, Township 6 North, Range 35 East, W. M.

ORS 540.621 provides that: "Whenever the owner of a perfected and developed water right certifies under oath to the Water Resources Director that the water right has been abandoned by him and that he desires cancellation thereof, the Water Resources Director shall enter an order canceling the water right."

NOW, THEREFORE, it hereby is ORDERED that the said water rights, being portions of the rights described by the certificates recorded at Page 7578, Volume 7, and recorded at Page 33483, Volume 25, State Record of Water Right Certificates, are canceled.

It is FURTHER ORDERED that the said certificates of water rights are canceled, and in lieu thereof new certificates be issued to describe the balance of the water rights NOT involved in this proceeding.
