ORDER APPROVING A CHANGE IN POINT OF DIVERSION

Pursuant to ORS 540.510 to 540.530, after notice was given and no objections were filed, and finding that no injury to existing water rights would result, this order approves, as conditioned or limited herein, TRANSFER 8706 submitted by

SAMUEL N. AND HEIDI MORASCH WELLS 81768 SOUTH FORK WALLA WALLA RIVER ROAD MILTON-FREEWATER, OREGON 97862.

The FIRST right to be modified was confirmed by decree of the Circuit Court of the State of Oregon for UMATILLA County as evidenced by a PORTION of Certificate 13177. The decree is recorded in the Order Record of the Water Resources Director in Volume 12, at Page 9. The date of priority is 1870.

The right allows the use of WALLA WALLA RIVER, a tributary of COLUMBIA RIVER, for IRRIGATION OF 11.1 ACRES. The amount of water to which this right is entitled is limited to an amount actually beneficially used and shall not exceed ONE AND ONE-HALF MINER'S INCHES, if available at the authorized point of diversion: NE% NE%, SECTION 27, T 5 N, R 36 E, W.M., or its equivalent in case of rotation, measured at the point of diversion from the source.

NOTICE OF RIGHT TO PETITION FOR RECONSIDERATION OR JUDICIAL REVIEW

This is an order in other than a contested case. This order is subject to judicial review under ORS 183.484. Any petition for judicial review must be filed within the 60 day time period specified by ORS 183.484(2).

Pursuant to ORS 536.075 and OAR 137-004-080 and OAR 690-01-005, you may either petition for judicial review or petition the Director for reconsideration of this order.

The authorized place of use is located as follows:

SE¼ SE¼ 11.1 ACRES SECTION 22

TOWNSHIP 5 NORTH, RANGE 36 EAST, W.M.

The right to use water for the above purpose is restricted to beneficial use on the lands or place of use described and is subject to all other conditions and limitations contained in the decree.

The SECOND right to be modified was confirmed by decree of the Circuit Court of the State of Oregon for UMATILLA County as evidenced by a PORTION of Certificate 12714. The decree is recorded in the Order Record of the Water Resources Director in Volume 12, at Page 9. The date of priority is 1885.

The right allows the use of WALLA WALLA RIVER AND SPRING WHICH FLOWS ACROSS LAND, a tributary of COLUMBIA RIVER, for IRRIGATION OF 11.60 ACRES. The amount of water to which this right is entitled is limited to an amount actually beneficially used and shall not exceed ONE AND ONE-HALF MINER'S INCHES, if available at the authorized point of diversion: SW% NE%, SECTION 26, T 5 N, R 36 E, W.M., or its equivalent in case of rotation, measured at the point of diversion from the source.

The authorized place of use is located as follows:

SE% SE% 9.4 ACRES SECTION 22

NE¼ NE¼ 2.2 ACRES SECTION 27

TOWNSHIP 5 NORTH, RANGE 36 EAST, W.M.

The right to use water for the above purpose is restricted to beneficial use on the lands or place of use described and is subject to all other conditions and limitations contained in the decree.

The applicant proposes to change the point of diversion for the above listed rights to:

NW¼ NW¼, SECTION 26, T 5 N, R 36 E, W.M.; 1055 FEET SOUTH AND 1095 FEET EAST FROM NW CORNER SECTION 26.

THIS CHANGE TO EXISTING WATER RIGHTS MAY BE MADE PROVIDED THE FOLLOWING CONDITIONS ARE MET BY THE WATER USER:

- 1. The proposed change shall be completed on or before October 1, 2005.
- 2. The quantity of water diverted at the new point of diversion, shall not exceed the quantity of water lawfully available at the original points of diversion.
- 3. The water user shall install and maintain a headgate, an inline flow meter, weir, or other suitable device for measuring and recording the quantity of water diverted. The type and plans of the headgate and measuring device must be approved by the Department prior to beginning construction and shall be installed under the general supervision of the Department.
- 4. Water shall be acquired from the same surface water source as the original point of diversion.
- 5. The water user shall install and maintain a fish screen or fish by-pass device. The type and plans of the screen or by-pass device must be approved by the Oregon Department of Fish and Wildlife prior to beginning of construction and shall be installed under the supervision of the Department of Fish and Wildlife.

The water user may participate in the Oregon Department of Fish and Wildlife's cost sharing program for installation of screening and by-pass devices in accordance with ORS 540.525.

Certificate 13177 and 12714 are canceled. New certificates will be issued to confirm those portions of the rights NOT involved in this transfer. When satisfactory proof of the completed change is received, new certificates confirming these water rights will be issued.
