ORDER

On June 3, 1980, Robert Baesler, acting for View Point Ranches, Inc., submitted an affidavit that they are the owners of a certain water right and the lands to which the water right is appurtenant; that they have abandoned any and all interest in and to the said water right and request the same be canceled.

The water right in question is a portion of the right described by the certificate recorded at page 34172, Volume 26, State Record of Water Right Certificates, in the name of West Sacramento Enterprises, Inc., and is for the use of not to exceed 0.32 cubic foot per second of water from three wells, with a date of priority of August 14, 1957, for irrigation of 11.0 acres in NE 1/4 SW 1/4, 0.3 acre in NW 1/4 SW 1/4, 3.8 acres in SE 1/4 SW 1/4, 4.0 acres in NE 1/4 SE 1/4, 1.1 acres in SE 1/4 SE 1/4, Section 19; 3.9 acres in NE 1/4 NE 1/4 and 1.6 acres in SE 1/4 NE 1/4, Section 30, Township 27 South, Range 19 South, W.M.

ORS 540.621 provides that: "Whenever the owner of a perfected and developed water right certifies under oath to the Water Resources Director that the water right has been abandoned by him and that he desires cancellation thereof, the Water Resources Director shall enter an order canceling the water right."

NOW, THEREFORE, it hereby is ORDERED that the said water right, being a portion of the right described by the certificate recorded at page 34172, Volume 26, State Record of Water Right Certificates, is canceled.

It is FURTHER ORDERED that the said certificate of water right is canceled, and in lieu thereof a new certificate be issued to describe the balance of the water right NOT involved in this proceeding.
