ORDER

WHEREAS, on the 6th day of July, 1920, the Willow Valley Irrigation District, Klamath County, Oregon, filed with the State Engineer of 1347 Oregon, an application No. 7379, for a permit to construct a reservoir and to store for beneficial use the unappropriated waters of the State of Oregon, and submitted therewith and thereafter certain plans and specifications of the dam to be constructed in connection with the reservoir; and

WHEREAS, the dam was to be more than ten feet in height and impound more than 3,000,000 gallons of water, the State Engineer had authority to examine and inspect said dam during the construction thereof, as provided by Section 5756, Oregon Laws and amendments thereto; and

WHEREAS, an inspection of said dam was made and the results thereof indicated that the plans for the construction of the dam as submitted by
the district's engineer and approved by the State Engineer had not been
complied with, in the respects set forth in the notice sent the district by
registered mail on November 10th, 1927; and

WHEREAS, the district was allowed until December 15th, 1927, within which time to conform with the requirements of the State Engineer as set forth in said notice; and

WHEREAS, it appears that the district has failed to complete the works as outlined in said notice and thereby has not complied with the State Engineer's requirements:

NOW, THEREFORE, it is hereby ORDERED that the district open the gates of said dam and not close the same until such time as the requirements of the State Engineer have been fully complied with.
