EXTENDING THE TIME) ORDER
LIMITS OF PERMIT 47436)

The Water Resources Director approved extensions of time limits for several permits in Special Order Volume 47, Pages 331 and 332. On September 16, 1993, the order was signed and record holders advised.

An ORDER of the Director is final after 60 days has passed from the date the ORDER was entered. The ORDER may be AMENDED if a request is filed timely.

Horace Daum sent a letter to the director about his permit extension of time approval. He had only eight days to comply with the order.


Permit 47436 allowed the use of 0.75 cubic foot of water per second from three streams for the irrigation and frost control for 16 acres, and fish culture. His extension request showed that he had abandoned the fish culture venture, reduced temperature control use to 1 1/2 Acres, and had only an additional 5 acres to irrigate.

Earlier this year, he had contacted Larry Toll, Watermaster, and wanted to know if the development of Permit 47436 could be continued even though he had not received a response to his extension request to October 1, 1993. Larry told him that it would be illegal to go ahead, so no progress was made on his project during the 1993 irrigation season. Mr. Daum's letter expresses his dissatisfaction with our delayed approval and wants the director to consider an extension to October 1, 1994.

It is reasonable to AMEND the ORDER and grant an extension of time limits to October 1, 1994 for permit 47436 to complete construction and use water to the fullest extent intended.

NOW THEREFORE, it is hereby ORDERED that the extension of time order entered September 16, 1993, Special Order Volume 47, page 332 is AMENDED to show an extension of time limits to complete construction and use water of October 1, 1994 for Horace Daum's permit 47436.
