ORDER APPROVING TRANSFER NO. 4581

On August 6, 1980, an application was filed in the office of the Water Resources Director by Manfred J.E. and Theresia M.F. Bialas for approval of changes in place of use and point of diversion of water from Evans Creek, pursuant to the provisions of ORS 540.510 to 540.530.

The certificate recorded at page 23876, Volume 17 of said record, in the name of Peter M. Riis, describes a right for the use of not to exceed 0.20 cubic foot per second from Evans Creek for irrigation of a certain 2.7 acres in NE 1/4 NW 1/4, 5.0 acres in SW 1/4 NW 1/4 and 8.3 acres in SE 1/4 NW 1/4, Section 12, Township 35 South, Range 4 West, W.M., with a date of priority of June 5, 1950.

Water for the said rights is diverted, through the Fielder or Hillis Ditch, from a point located 475 feet South and 120 feet East from the Northwest Corner, Section 7, being within the NW 1/4 NW 1/4, Section 7, Township 35 South, Range 3 West, W.M.

The applicants herein, owners of the lands above described, propose to sever the right therefrom and, without loss of priority, to irrigate in lieu thereof a certain 14.0 acres in SE 1/4 NE 1/4, Section 11 and 2.0 acres in SW 1/4 NW 1/4, Section 12, Township 35 South, Range 4 West, W.M., from a point of diversion located 1150 feet North and 20 feet West from the East Quarter Corner of Section 11, being within the SE 1/4 NE 1/4, Section 11, Township 35 South, Range 4 West, W.M.

Notice of the application, pursuant to ORS 540.520(2), was published in the Mail Tribune, a newspaper printed and having general circulation in Jackson County, Oregon, for a period of three weeks in the issues of August 14, 21 and 28, 1980.

Mr. David C. Hendrix, Watermaster, has filed a statement to the effect that the proposed changes in place of use and point of diversion may be made without injury to existing rights.

No objections having been filed and it appearing that the proposed changes in place of use and point of diversion may be made without injury to existing rights, the application should be approved.

NOW, THEREFORE, it hereby is ORDERED that the requested changes in place of use and point of diversion, as described herein, without loss of priority, are approved.

It is FURTHER ORDERED that the quantity of water diverted at the new point of diversion shall not exceed the quantity of water available at the old point of diversion under the subject right.

It is FURTHER ORDERED that the following provisions shall be effective when in the judgment of the watermaster it becomes necessary to install headgates and measuring devices:

> That the diversion works shall include an in line flow meter, a weir, or other suitable device for measuring the water to which the applicant is entitled;

> That the type and plans of the measuring device be approved by the watermaster before the beginning of construction work and that the weir or measuring device be installed under the general supervision of said watermaster.

It is FURTHER ORDERED that the construction work shall be completed and the change in point of diversion made on or before October 1, 1982.

It is FURTHER DRDERED that said water so transferred shall be applied to beneficial use on or before October 1, 1982.

It is FURTHER ORDERED that the certificate recorded at page 23876, Volume 17, State Record of Water Right Certificates, is canceled; and upon proof satisfactory to the Water Resources Director of completion of works and beneficial use of water to the extent intended under the provisions of this order, a confirming certificate of water right shall be issued to the applicants herein.
