)) AUTHORIZING WELL REGISTRATION

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On January 17, 1962 Jack Watanabe and Kiku Watanabe, husband and wife, filed a petition in the office of the State Engineer requesting that they be allowed to register an irrigation well under the provisions of ORS 537.605.

The petition states that well construction was begun and completed in May, 1935. The well is located within the SE_4^1 of the NW_4^1 of Section 36, Township 1 North, Range 3 East of the W.M. Ground water from this well was first used at a rate of 60 g.p.m. for the irrigation of 18 acres in June, 1935. The well is 60 feet deep and 10 inches in diameter. This artesian well flows at a rate of 5 g.p.m. into Beaver Creek, a tributary of the Sandy River during periods of non-use. The well is equipped with a 5 h.p. Pomona pump and G. E. motor. The well has been used each year since its construction for irrigation of 18 acres of land in Clackamas County.

It appears that Jack Watanabe and Kiku Watanabe have a vested ground water right that would be subject to determination under ORS 537.670 to 537.695.

NOW, THEREFORE, it is ORDERED that Jack Watanabe and Kiku Watanabe are authorized to register their irrigation well in accordance with the procedures set forth in ORS 537.605.
