ORDER APPROVING TRANSFER NO. 3425

On June 15, 1976, Truman Dean Collins and Z. Idelle Collins filed an application for transfer of water right in the office of the Water Resources Director proposing a change in point of diversion under an existing right of record from Rogue River.

Certificate of water right issued to Chas. and Lillian Shelton and recorded at Page 10541, Volume 10, State Record of Water Right Certificates, confirms a right which includes the use of not to exceed 0.39 cubic foot per second from Rogue River for the irrigation of 15.0 acres in $NE_4^{\frac{1}{4}}$ $NE_4^{\frac{1}{4}}$, and 16.0 acres in $SE_4^{\frac{1}{4}}$ $NE_4^{\frac{1}{4}}$, Section 28, Township 34 South, Range 1 West, W.M., with a date of priority of July 5, 1928.

These lands are irrigated by means of the Dennis, Johnson & Hall ditch from a point of diversion located 1320 feet North and 800 feet West from the Southeast corner of Section 16, being within the $SE_4^{\frac{1}{4}}$ $SE_4^{\frac{1}{4}}$, Section 16, Township 34 South, Range 1 West, W.M.

The applicant herein, owner of the lands above described, proposes to irrigate these lands from a point of diversion to be located 1890 feet South and 2260 feet West from the Northeast corner of Section 28, being within the SW_4^1 NE_4^2 , Section 28, Township 34 South, Range 1 West, W.M.

Notice of the application, pursuant to ORS 540.510 was published in the Medford Mail Tribune, a newspaper printed and having general circulation in Jackson County, Oregon, for a period of three weeks in the issues of July 6, 13 and 20, 1976.

Mr. David C. Herdrix, Watermaster of District No. 13, has filed a statement to the effect that the proposed change in point of diversion may be made without injury to existing rights.

No objection having been filed and it appearing that the proposed change in point of diversion may be made without injury to existing rights, the application should be approved.

NOW, THEREFORE, it hereby is ORDERED that the requested change in point of diversion described herein, without loss of priority, is approved.

It is FURTHER ORDERED that the quantity of water diverted at the new point of diversion shall not exceed the quantity of water available at the old point of diversion, and shall not exceed 0.39 cubic foot per second.

It is FURTHER ORDERED that the following provisions shall be effective when in the judgement of the watermaster it becomes necessary to install headgates and measuring devices.

That the diversion works shall include an in line flow meter, a weir, or other suitable device for measuring the water to which the applicant is entitled.

That the type and plans of the measuring device be approved by the watermaster before the beginning of construction work and that the weir or measuring device be installed under the general supervision of said watermaster.

It is FURTHER ORDERED that the construction work shall be completed and the change in point of diversion of water made on or before October 1, 1977.

It is FURTHER ORDERED that the portion of the right involved in the change authorized herein NOT be included in the new certificate to be issued as provided by the order entered September 15, 1976, approving transfer application No. 3422, and upon receipt of proof satisfactory to the Water Resources Director of completion of the change in point of diversion authorized herein, a certificate of water right shall be issued to Truman Dean Collins and Z. Idelle Collins confirming the change in point of diversion.
