
IN THE MATTER OF THE DETERMINATION)

OF WHITE RIVER AND ITS TRIBUTARIES,) TO COURT.
A TRIBUTARY OF THE DESCHUTES RIVER.)

Now at this time this matter coming on for consideration by the State Water Board on the motion of Lost and Boulder Ditch Company, a corporation, by its attorney, Francis V. Galloway, for an amendment of its findings and order of determination relative to the place of measurement of the water to which said company was found to be entitled, and it appearing that said findings and order of determination provided that said water should be measured at the point of diversion from the streams; that it is a distance of approximately 9 miles from the point of diversion of the Lost and Boulder ditch from Boulder Creek, to the head of the main laterals of said system, and that there is a considerable loss of water by seepage between said points; the greater part of which finds its way back to the stream channel; that there is a stipulation in the record providing that the amount of water to which said Company is entitled may be measured at the head of said main lateral; and that said Company is therefore entitled to have said water measured at said point; that proceedings for the determination of rights to the waters of White River and its tributaries are now pending before the Circuit Court of the State of Oregon for Wasco County; NOW, THEREFORE, IT IS HEREBY RECOMMENDED TO THE COURT, that there be embodied in its decree in this matter a modification of the findings and order of determination of the State Water Board to the effect that whatever amount of water the said Lost and Boulder Ditch Company be found to be entitled to, shall be measured


at or near the division box at the head of the said main laterals of said Ditch Company, which division box is located in the NE $\frac{1}{4}$ SW $\frac{1}{4}$ of Section 10, T 5 S. R. 11 E. W. M.; provided, that said Company shall at all times keep its said ditch in a reasonably good state of repair, so as to minimize as far as possible said seepage loss.
