ORDER

EXTENDING TIME

On October 24, 1952, the Lakeview Water Users, Incorporated, filed an application for an extension of time within which to complete its inchoate water right.

By decree of the Circuit Court for Lake County, dated May 15, 1923, in the matter of the determination of the relative rights to the use of the waters of Drew Creek, Antelope Creek, Cottonwood Creek, Thomas Creek, and Cogswell Creek, and their tributaries, tributaries of Goose Lake, an inchoate water right was awarded to the Goose Lake Valley Irrigation Company, predecessor in interest of the Lakeview Water Users, Incorporated. The decree fixed the time within which to perfect and complete the inchoate water right and provided that such time could be extended by the State Engineer for good cause shown. The time as extended by the State Engineer expired October 1, 1952.

From the application of the Lakeview Water Users, Incorporated, it appears that said corporation has not fully completed its inchoate water right, although it has made reasonable efforts to reclaim the lands and used due diligence in the prosecution of the work necessary therefor, and that an extension of time should be granted.

NOW, THEREFORE, it hereby is ORDERED that the Lakeview Water Users, Incorporated, as successor in interest to the Goose Lake Valley Irrigation Company, shall have until October 1, 1954 within which to complete its inchoate water right.
