IN THE MATTER OF THE APPLICATION OF EAST FORK IRRIGATION DISTRICT FOR AN EXTENSION OF TIME WITHIN WHICH TO COMPLETE ITS INCHOATE WATER RIGHT AWARDED IN THE HOOD RIVER ADJUDICATION PROCEEDINGS.

ORDER

EXTENDING TIME

On October 21, 1955, the East Fork Irrigation District filed an application for an extension of time within which to complete its inchoate water rights.

By decree of the court for Hood River County, dated October 24, 1921, in the matter of the determination of the relative rights to the use of the waters of Hood River and its tributaries, an inchoate water right was awarded to the East Fork Irrigation District. The decree fixed the time within which to perfect and complete the inchoate water right and provided that such time could be extended by the State Engineer for good cause The time as extended by the State Engineer expired October 1, 1955.

From the application it appears that the inchoate water right has not been fully completed, although reasonable efforts to reclaim the lands have been made and due diligence used in prosecution of the work necessary therefore, and that an extension of time should be granted.

NOW THEREFORE, it hereby is ORDERED that the East Fork Irrigation District shall have until October 1, 1960, within which to complete its inchoate water right.
