On September 4, 1968, H. L. Hayden filed an application in the office of the State Engineer for the approval of a change in point of diversion of water from Alsea River, pursuant to the provisions of ORS 540.510 to 540.530.

Certificate of water right issued to H. L. Hayden and recorded at page 17129, Volume 14, State Record of Water Right Certificates, confirms a right to the use of not to exceed 0.32 cubic foot per second of water from Alsea River for the irrigation of 2.8 acres in SWA NWA, 13.5 acres in SEA NWA, 6.8 acres in NEA SWA and 2.3 acres in NWA SWA, Section 2, Township 14 South, Range 8 West, W.M., with a date of priority of May 28, 1942. These lands are irrigated from a point of diversion located N 57° 30' W 2720 feet from the most easterly SE corner of James Edwards DLC #41 being within the SEA NWA of Section 2, Township 14 South, Range 8 West, W.M.

The applicant herein, owner of the lands above described, proposes to irrigate these lands from a point of diversion to be located N 69° 24' W 2956 feet from the most easterly SE corner of James Edwards DLC #41 being within the SW% NW% of Section 2, Township 14 South, Range 8 West, W.M.

Notice by publication as provided by ORS 540.520 was not given in connection with this application for the reason said section provides notice is not required on an application for a change in point of diversion of water of less than one-fourth mile where there are no intervening diversions.

Mr. Ralph H. Jackson, Watermaster of District No. 2, has filed a report to the effect that the proposed change in point of diversion of water may be made without injury to existing rights.

No objections having been filed and it appearing that the proposed point of diversion of water may be established without injury to existing rights, the application should be approved.

NOW, THEREFORE, it hereby is ORDERED that the change in point of diversion of water from Alsea River, to-wit:

From a point located N 57° 30' W 2720 feet from the most easterly SE corner of James Edwards DLC #41 being within the SE% NW% of Section 2, Township 14 South, Range 8 West. W.M.

To a point to be located N 69° 24' W 2956 feet from the most easterly SE corner of James Edwards DLC #41 being within the SW% NW% of Section 2, Township 14 South, Range 8 West, W.M.

for the irrigation of 2.8 acres in SWM NWM, 13.5 acres in SEM NWM, 6.8 acres in NEM SWM and 2.3 acres in NWM SWM, Section 2, Township 14 South, Range 8 West, W.M., with a date of priority of May 28, 1942, is approved.

It is FURTHER ORDERED that the construction work shall be completed and the change in point of diversion of water made on or before October 1, 1969.

It is FURTHER ORDERED that the quantity of water diverted at the new point of diversion shall not exceed the quantity of water available at the old point of diversion and shall not exceed 0.32 cubic foot per second.

It is FURTHER ORDERED that the following provisions shall be effective when in the judgement of the watermaster it becomes necessary to install headques or measuring devices.

That the diversion works shall include an in-line flow meter, a weir, or other suitable device for measuring the water to which the applicant is entitled.

That the type and plans of the measuring device be approved by the Watermaster before the beginning of construction work and that the weir or measuring device be installed under the general supervision of said watermaster.

It is FURTHER ORDERED that certificate of water right heretofore issued to H. L. Hayden and recorded at page 17129, Volume 14,
State Record of Water Right Certificates, is canceled and upon receipt
of proof satisfactory to the State Engineer of completion of the
authorized change in point of diversion, a certificate of water right
shall be issued to H. L. Hayden confirming the change in point of diversion.
