ORDER APPROVING A CHANGE IN POINT OF DIVERSION

Pursuant to ORS 540.510 to 540.530, after notice was given and no objections were filed, and finding that no injury to existing water rights would result, this order approves, as conditioned or limited herein, TRANSFER 6516 submitted by

EUGENE F. MAAHS
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The right to be modified was confirmed by decree of the Circuit Court of the State of Oregon for UMATILLA County. The decree is recorded in the Order Record of the Water Resources Director in Volume 3, at Page 127. The date of priority is FEBRUARY 25, 1904.

The right allows the use of UMATILLA RIVER, a tributary of COLUMBIA RIVER, for IRRIGATION OF 3.0 ACRES. This right is limited to 0.075 cubic foot per second, if available at the authorized point of diversion: NE $\frac{1}{4}$ SW $\frac{1}{4}$, SECTION 28, T 4 N, R 28 E, W.M.; MAXWELL CANAL - 1370 FEET NORTH AND 1000 FEET EAST FROM THE SW CORNER OF SECTION 28, or its equivalent in case of rotation, measured at the point of diversion from the source.

The authorized place of use is located as follows:

SW $\frac{1}{4}$ NE $\frac{1}{4}$ 3.0 ACRES
SECTION 4
TOWNSHIP 4 NORTH, RANGE 28 EAST, W.M.

The right to use water for the above purpose is restricted to beneficial use on the lands or place of use described and is subject to all other conditions and limitations contained in the decree.

The applicant proposes to change the point of diversion to:

SW $\frac{1}{4}$ NE $\frac{1}{4}$, SECTION 4, T 4 N, R 28 E, W.M.; 770 FEET NORTH AND 120 FEET WEST OF SE CORNER SW $\frac{1}{4}$ NE $\frac{1}{4}$.

THIS CHANGE TO AN EXISTING WATER RIGHT MAY BE MADE PROVIDED THE FOLLOWING CONDITIONS ARE MET BY THE WATER USER:

1. The proposed change shall be completed on or before October 1, 1993.
2. The quantity of water diverted at the new point of diversion, together with that diverted at the old diversion, shall not exceed the quantity of water available at the old point of diversion.

3. The water user shall install and maintain a headgate, an in-line flow meter, weir, or other suitable device for measuring and recording the quantity of water diverted. The type and plans of the headgate and measuring device must be approved by the Department prior to beginning construction and shall be installed under the general supervision of the Department.
4. The water user or irrigation district shall operate and maintain the headgate and measuring device, as needed. The water user or irrigation district shall report total flow figures when requested by the Watermaster. The Watermaster may operate the headgate and monitor accuracy of the measuring device, as needed.

When satisfactory proof of the completed change is received, a new certificate confirming this water right will be issued.
