On November 8, 1985, an application was filed in the office of the Water Resources Director by Tom DeArmond for approval of an additional point of appropriation of water from ground water, pursuant to the provisions of ORS 537.705.

The certificate recorded at page 45552, Volume 38, State Record of Water Right Certificates, in the name of Tom DeArmond, describes a right for the use of not to exceed 1.39 cubic feet per second from ground water for irrigation of:

0.3 acre NE 1/4 NE 1/4
2.4 acres SE 1/4 NE 1/4
Section 31
4.5 acres NW 1/4 NE 1/4
19.0 acres SW 1/4 NE 1/4
7.8 acres NE 1/4 NW 1/4
8.4 acres NW 1/4 NW 1/4
38.8 acres SW 1/4 NW 1/4
30.5 acres SE 1/4 NW 1/4
Section 32
All as projected within Churchill DLC 56
Township 4 South, Range 1 West WM

with a date of priority of May 23, 1972.

The authorized point of appropriation is located 980 feet North and 1650 feet East from the West Quarter Corner of Section 32, as projected within Churchill DLC 56, being within the SE 1/4 NW 1/4 of Section 32, Township 4 South, Range 1 West, WM.

The applicant herein, owner of the lands above described, proposes to add an additional well located 50 feet North and 650 feet West from the Center of Section 32, being within the SE 1/4 NW 1/4 of Section 32, Township 4 South, Range 1 West, WM. The additional point of appropriation is reported to be completed.

Clifton R. King, Watermaster, has filed a statement to the effect that the proposed additional point of appropriation may be made without injury to existing rights.

Robert A. Back, Hydrogeologist, has filed a statement to the effect that the proposed additional point of appropriation may be made without injury to existing rights.

No objections having been filed and it appearing that the proposed additional point of appropriation may be made without injury to existing rights, the application should be approved.

NOW, THEREFORE, it hereby is ORDERED that the proposed additional point of appropriation is approved, without loss of priority.

It is FURTHER ORDERED that the quantity of water appropriated at the new well, together with that appropriated at the old well, shall not exceed the quantity of water available at the old well under the subject right, and shall not exceed 1.39 cubic feet per second.

It is FURTHER ORDERED that the following provisions shall be effective when in the judgment of the Watermaster it becomes necessary to install measuring devices:

> That the pump system shall include an in-line flow meter or other suitable device for measuring the water to which the applicant is entitled;

> That the type and plans of the measuring device be approved by the Watermaster before the beginning of construction work and that the measuring device be installed under the general supervision of said Watermaster.

It is FURTHER ORDERED that the certificate recorded at page 45552, Volume 38, State Record of Water Right Certificates, is canceled; and upon proof satisfactory to the Water Resources Director of completion of works and beneficial use of water to the extent intended under the provisions of this order, a confirming certificate of water right shall be issued to the applicant herein.
