On May 14, 1982, an application was filed in the office of the Water Resources Director by Lettie M. Toman for approval of a change in point of diversion of water from North Umpqua River, pursuant to the provisions of ORS 540.510 to 540.530.

The certificate recorded at page 49000, Volume 42, State Record of Water Right Certificates, in the name of G. H. Harrell, describes a right which includes the use of not to exceed 0.015 cubic foot per second from North Umpqua River, for irrigation of 1.20 acres in SE 1/4 SW 1/4, Section 14, Township 26 South, Range 6 West, WM, with a date of priority of May 13, 1963.

Water for the said right is diverted from a point located 2,550 feet South and 2,620 feet West from the East Quarter Corner of Section 14, being within the SW 1/4 SE 1/4 of Section 14, Township 26 South, Range 6 West, WM.

The applicant herein, owner of the lands above described, proposes to change the point of diversion therefrom, without loss of priority, to a point located 100 feet South and 2,180 feet East from the Northwest Corner of Section 23, being within the NE I/4 NW I/4 of Section 23, Township 26 South, Range 6 West, WM.

Notice of the application, pursuant to ORS 540.520(2), was published in the News-Review, a newspaper printed and having general circulation in Douglas County, Oregon, for a period of three weeks in the issues of July 13, 20 and 27, 1982.

Gary L. Ball, Watermaster, has filed a statement to the effect that the proposed change in point of diversion may be made without injury to existing rights.

No objections having been filed and it appearing that the proposed change in point of diversion may be made without injury to existing rights, the application should be approved.

NOW, THEREFORE, it hereby is ORDERED that the requested change in point of diversion, as described herein, without loss of priority, is approved, <u>WITH THE</u> FOLLOWING CONDITIONS.

The quantity of water diverted at the new point of diversion shall not exceed 0.015 cubic foot per second, and together with that diverted at the old point of diversion, shall not exceed the quantity of water available at the old point of diversion under the subject right.

The following provisions shall be effective when in the judgment of the Watermaster it becomes necessary to install headgates and measuring devices:

That the diversion works shall include an in line flow meter, a weir, or other suitable device for measuring the water to which the applicant is entitled;

That the type and plans of the measuring device be approved by the watermaster before the beginning of construction work and that the weir or measuring device be installed under the general supervision of said Watermaster.

The construction work shall be completed and water used from the proposed point of diversion on or before October 1, 1984.

It is FURTHER ORDERED that the certificate recorded at page 49000, Volume 42, State Record of Water Right Certificates, is canceled; and in lieu thereof a new certificate be issued covering the balance of the right NOT involved in this proceeding; and upon proof satisfactory to the Water Resources Director of completion of works and beneficial use of water to the extent intended under the provisions of this order, a confirming certificate of water right shall be issued to the applicant herein.
