IN THE MATTER OF THE APPLICATION OF RICHARD J. AND ROSEMARY STANEK FOR APPROVAL OF CHANGES IN PLACE OF USE AND POINT OF DIVERSION OF WATER FROM ANDERSON CREEK

ORDER APPROVING TRANSFER NO. 3635

On April 20, 1977, an application was filed in the office of the Water Resources Director by Richard J. and Rosemary Stanek for changes in place of use and point of diversion under an existing water right of record, pursuant to the provisions of ORS 540.510 to 540.530.

The certificate recorded at page 41776, Volume 33, State Record of Water Right Certificates, in the name of Richard J. Stanek, describes a right which includes the use of not to exceed 0.015 cubic foot per second from Anderson Creek for irrigation of 0.6 acres in NE½ NW½ of Section 7, Township 39 South, Range 1 West, W.M., with a date of priority of 1892.

Water for the said right is diverted from a point located 1290 feet South and 760 feet West from the North quarter corner of Section 7, being within the NE $\frac{1}{4}$ NW $\frac{1}{4}$ of said Section 7.

The applicants herein, owners of the lands above described, propose to change the place of use and point of diversion therefrom and, without loss of priority, to irrigate in lieu thereof, a certain 0.6 acre in SW4 SW4 of Section 33, Township 38 South, Range 1 West, W.M., from a point of diversion located 400 feet North and 480 feet East from the Southwest corner of Section 33, being within the SW4 SW4 of said Section 33.

Notice of the application, pursuant to ORS 540.510, was published in the Ashland Daily Tidings, a newspaper printed and having general circulation in Jackson County, Oregon, for a period of three weeks in the issues of August 17, 24 and 31, 1977.

Mr. David C. Hendrix, Watermaster, has filed a statement to the effect that the proposed changes in place of use and point of diversion may be made without injury to existing rights.

No objections having been filed and it appearing that the proposed changes in place of use and point of diversion may be made without injury to existing rights, the application should be approved.

NOW, THEREFORE, it hereby is ORDERED that the requested changes in place of use and point of diversion, as described herein, without loss of priority, are approved.

It is FURTHER ORDERED that the quantity of water diverted at the new point of diversion shall not exceed the quantity of water available at the old point of diversion under the subject right, and shall not exceed 0.015 cubic foot per second.

It is FURTHER ORDERED that the following provisions shall be effective when in the judgement of the watermaster it becomes necessary to install head-gates and measuring devices:

That the diversion works shall include an in line flow meter, a weir, or other suitable device for measuring the water to which the applicant is entitled;

That the type and plans of the measuring device be approved by the watermaster before the beginning of construction work and that the weir or measuring device be installed under the general supervision of said watermaster.

It is FURTHER ORDERED that the construction work shall be completed and the change in point of diversion of water made and said water so transferred shall be applied to beneficial use on or before October 1, 1979.

It is FURTHER ORDERED that the certificate of water right heretofore issued to Richard J. Stanek and recorded at page 41776, Volume 33, State Record of Water Right Certificates, is canceled, and in lieu thereof a new certificate be issued

covering the balance of the right NOT involved in this proceeding, and upon proof satisfactory to the Water Resources Director of completion of works and beneficial use of water to the extent intended under the provisions of this order, a confirming certificate of water right shall be issued to the applicants herein.
