ORDER APPROVING TRANSFER NO. 3923

On April 6, 1978, an application was filed in the office of the Water Resources Director by Donald Stephens for approval of changes in place of use and point of diversion of water from Rock Creek, pursuant to the provisions of ORS 540.510 to 540.530.

The certificate recorded at page 4114, Volume 5, State Record of Water Right Certificates, in the name of E. Douglas, describes a right which includes the use of water from Rock Creek for irrigation of a certain 4.5 acres in SW¹/₄ NW¹/₄ of Section 35, Township 7 South, Range 38 East, W.M., with a date of priority of 1883.

Water for the said right is diverted, through the Toney (Toney Blize) Ditch, from a point located 454 feet North and 330 feet West from the East Quarter Corner of Section 34, being within the SE_4^{1} NE_4^{1} of Section 34, Township 7 South, Range 38 East, W.M.

The applicant herein, owner of the lands above described, proposes to change the place of use and point of diversion therefrom and, without loss of priority, to irrigate in lieu thereof a certain 4.5 acres in NE¼ NW¾ of Section 35, Township 7 South, Range 38 East, W.M., from a point of diversion located 578 feet North and 1114 feet East from the West Quarter Corner of Section 35, being within the SW¼ NW¾ of Section 35, Township 7 South, Range 38 East, W.M.

Notice of the application, pursuant to ORS 540.520(2), was published in the Baker Democrat-Herald, a newspaper printed and having general circulation in Baker County, Oregon, for a period of three weeks in the issues of September 11, 18 and 25, 1978.

Mr. V. Kent Searles, Watermaster, has filed a statement to the effect that the proposed changes in place of use and point of diversion may be made without injury to existing rights.

No objections having been filed and it appearing that the proposed changes in place of use and point of diversion may be made without injury to existing rights, the application should be approved.

NOW, THEREFORE, it hereby is ORDERED that the requested changes in place of use and point of diversion, as described herein, without loss of priority, are approved.

It is FURTHER ORDERED that the quantity of water diverted at the new point of diversion shall not exceed the quantity of water available at the old point of diversion under the subject right.

It is FURTHER ORDERED that the following provisions shall be carried out prior to the diverting of water at the new point of diversion as herein confirmed:

That the diversion works shall include an in line flow meter, a weir, or other suitable device for measuring the water to which the applicant is entitled;

That the type and plans of the measuring device be approved by the watermaster before the beginning of construction work and that the weir or measuring device be installed under the general supervision of said watermaster.

It is FURTHER ORDERED that the construction work shall be completed and the change in point of diversion of water made and that said water so transferred shall be applied to beneficial use on or before October 1, 1980.

It is FURTHER ORDERED that the certificate of water right recorded at page 4114, Volume 5, State Record of Water Right Certificates, is canceled; and in lieu thereof a new certificate be issued covering the balance of the right NOT involved in this proceeding; and upon proof satisfactory to the Water Resources Director of completion of works and beneficial use of water to the extent intended under the provisions of this order, a confirming certificate of water right shall be issued to the applicant herein.
