ORDER

On September 10, 1982, Woodrow and Edith May Walker of 2277 Nelson Lane, Hermiston, Oregon 97838 and Henry F. and Doris N. Walker of Route 1, Box 38, Echo, Oregon 97826, submitted affidavits that they are the owners of a certain water right and the lands to which the water right is appurtenant; that they have abandoned any and all interest in and to the said water right and request the same be canceled.

The water right in question was established by Decree of Circuit Court for Umatilla County, entered September 9, 1916, in the Matter of the Determination of the Relative Rights to the Use of the Waters of Butter Creek, tabulated in the name of W. B. Hamilton, at page 270, Volume 1, Order Record of the Water Resources Director, and is a portion of the right described by the certificate recorded at page 2668, Volume 3, State Record of Water Right Certificates, in the name of W. B. Hamilton, and is for the use of not to exceed 0.172 cubic foot per second of water from Butter Creek, with a date of priority of 1864, for irrigation of 10.3 acres in the NW4 SE4 Section 8, Township 3 North, Range 28 East, WM.

ORS 540.621 provides that: "Whenever the owner of a perfected and developed water right certifies under oath to the Water Resources Director that the water right has been abandoned by him and that he desires cancellation thereof, the Water Resources Director shall enter an order canceling the water right."

NOW, THEREFORE, it is hereby ORDERED that the said water right, being a portion of the right described by the certificate recorded at page 2668, Volume 3, State Record of Water Right Certificates, is canceled.

It is FURTHER ORDERED that the said certificate of water right is canceled, and in lieu thereof a new certificate be issued to describe the balance of the water right NOT involved in this proceeding.
