Authority

ORS 540.505 to 540.580 establishes the process in which a water right holder may submit a request to transfer the point of diversion, place of use, or character of use authorized under an existing water right. OAR Chapter 690, Division 380 implements the statutes and provides the Department's procedures and criteria for evaluating transfer applications.

Findings of Fact

Background

- On May 23, 2003, KIRPAL LIGHT SATSANG, INC. filed an application for an additional point of diversion under Permit S-51211. The Department assigned the application number T-9447.
- 2. On February 10, 2012, Certificate 87402 was issued to confirm the use of water under Permit S-51211.
- 3. On April 3, 2012, the applicant submitted an amended map clarifying the location of the additional point of diversion.
- 4. The portion of the right to be transferred is as follows:

Certificate: 87402 in the name of KIRPAL LIGHT SATSANG INC. (perfected under

Permit S-51211)

Use: DOMESTIC USE FOR TWO FAMILIES; IRRIGATION OF 36.4 ACRES

AND SUPPLEMENTAL IRRIGATION OF 34.5 ACRES

Priority Date: JUNE 14, 1990

This final order is subject to judicial review by the Court of Appeals under ORS 183.482. Any petition for judicial review must be filed within the 60-day time period specified by ORS 183.482(1). Pursuant to ORS 536.075 and OAR 137-003-0675, you may petition for judicial review or petition the Director for reconsideration of this order. Limit/Duty: The amount of water used for irrigation, together with the amount secured

under any other right existing for the same lands, is limited to a diversion of ONE-EIGHTIETH of one cubic foot per second, or its equivalent for each acre irrigated, and shall be further limited to a diversion of not to exceed 2.5 acre-feet per acre for each acre irrigated during the irrigation season of each

year.

- 5. Certificate 87402 does not specify that the Unnamed Stream is tributary to Bottle Creek, which is tributary to the Umpqua River, a tributary of the Pacific Ocean.
- 6. Transfer Application T-9447 proposes an additional point of diversion on the Unnamed Stream, approximately 1880 feet upstream to:

- 7. Notice of the application for transfer was published on June 10, 2003, pursuant to OAR 690-380-4000. In addition, notice of Transfer Application T-9447 was published in The New Review newspaper on August 27, and September 3 and 10, 2003. No comments were filed in response to the notices.
- 8. On May 10, 2012, the Department sent a copy of the draft Preliminary Determination proposing to approve Transfer Application T-9447 to the applicant. The draft Preliminary Determination cover letter set forth a deadline of June 4, 2012, for the applicant to respond. The applicant requested that the Department proceed with issuance of a Preliminary Determination.
- 9. On May 31, 2012, the Department issued a Preliminary Determination proposing to approve Transfer Application T-9447 and sent a copy to the applicant. Additionally, notice of the Preliminary Determination for the transfer application was published on the Department's weekly notice on June 5, 2012, pursuant to ORS 540.520 and OAR 690-380-4020. No protests were filed in response to the notice.
- 10. The Oregon Department of Fish and Wildlife has determined that fish are not present at the proposed additional point of diversion; therefore, a fish screen is not necessary.

Transfer Review Criteria [OAR 690-380-4010(2)]

- 11. Water has been used within the five-year period prior to submittal of the transfer application according to the terms and conditions of the right. There is no information in the record that would demonstrate that the right is subject to forfeiture under ORS 540.610. Certificate 87402 was issued on February 10, 2012, confirming the use of water under Permit 51211.
- 12. A pump, pipeline, and sprinkler system sufficient to use the full amount of water allowed under the existing right were present within the five-year period prior to submittal of Transfer Application T-9447.
- 13. The proposed change would not result in enlargement of the right.
- 14. The proposed change would not result in injury to other water rights.

Conclusions of Law

The additional point of diversion proposed in Transfer Application T-9447 is consistent with the requirements of ORS 540.505 to 540.580 and OAR 690-380-5000.

Now, therefore, it is ORDERED:

- 1. The additional point of diversion proposed in Transfer Application T-9447 is approved.
- 2. The right to the use of the water is restricted to beneficial use at the place of use described, and is subject to all other conditions and limitations contained in Certificate 87402 and any related decree.
- 3. Water right certificate 87402 is cancelled. A new certificate will be issued describing that portion of the right not affected by this transfer.
- 4. The quantity of water diverted at the additional point of diversion, together with that diverted at the original points of diversion, shall not exceed the quantity of water lawfully available at the original points of diversion.
- 5. The total diverted for irrigation and supplemental irrigation purposes from the Unnamed Stream, Surface Run-Off, and Reservoirs A, B, C, D, and E is limited to 0.89 cfs, or its equivalent in case of rotation, measured at the points of diversion.
- 6. Water use measurement conditions:
 - a. Before water use may begin under this order, the water user shall install a totalizing flow meter, or, with prior approval of the Director, another suitable measuring device, at each point of diversion from the Unnamed Stream.
 - b. The water user shall maintain the meters or measuring devices in good working order.
 - c. The water user shall allow the Watermaster access to the meters or measuring devices; provided however, where the meters or measuring devices are located within a private structure, the Watermaster shall request access upon reasonable notice.
- 7. Full beneficial use of the water shall be made, consistent with the terms of this order, on or before **October 1, 2013**. A Claim of Beneficial Use prepared by a Certified Water Right Examiner shall be submitted by the applicant to the Department within one year after the deadline for completion of the change and full beneficial use of the water.
- 8. After satisfactory proof of beneficial use is received, a new certificate confirming the right transferred will be issued.
