The Powder Valley Water Control District filed an application with the Water Resources Director for approval of an additional point of diversion of water from Rock Creek, as provided by ORS 540.510 to 540.530.

By Decree of the Circuit Court for Baker County, Oregon, entered March 18, 1918, In the Matter of the Determination of the Relative Rights to the Use of the Waters of the Powder River and its tributaries, a water right was allowed in the name of J.K. Fisher for the use of Water from Rock creek for irrigation of, among other lands, a certain 40 acres SW 1/4 NE 1/4, 40 acres SE 1/4 NE 1/4, 40 acres NE 1/4 SE 1/4, 40 acres NW 1/4 SE 1/4, Section 26, Township 7 South, Range 38 East, W.M.; being tabulated in Volume 6, page 291, with a date of priority of 1879, as evidenced by certificate 4151. These lands are irrigated by means of the Fisher Ditch.

The applicant proposes to retain the present point of diversion and add a diversion located 3040 feet South and 3102 feet West from the northeast corner of Section 34, being within the NE 1/4 SW 1/4, Section 34, Township 7 South, Range 38 East, W.M.

No objections having been filed, and it appearing that the proposed additional point of diversion may be made without injury to existing rights, the proposed change should be approved.

NOW, THEREFORE, it is hereby ORDERED that the proposed additional point of diversion is approved, without loss of priority.

It is FURTHER ORDERED that the quantity of water diverted at the new point of diversion, together with that diverted at the Fisher Ditch, shall not exceed the quantity of water available at the Fisher Ditch under the subject right.

It is FURTHER ORDERED that the following provisions shall be carried out prior to the diverting of water at the new point of diversion as herein confirmed:

The diversion works shall include a headgate, in-line flow meter, a weir, or other suitable device for measuring the water to which the applicant is entitled;

The type and plans of the headgate and measuring device must be approved by the Watermaster before the beginning of construction work and that the weir or measuring device be installed under the general supervision of said Watermaster.

It is FURTHER ORDERED that water shall be used from the new diversion point on or before October 1, 1991.

It is FURTHER ORDERED that certificate 4151 is canceled and in lieu thereof a new certificate be issued covering the balance of the right NOT involved in this proceeding NOR canceled by an order entered December 29, 1989. Upon proof satisfactory to the Water Resources Director of completion of works and beneficial use of water to the extent intended under the provisions of this order, a confirming certificate of water right shall be issued.
