On August 26, 1983, an application was filed in the office of the Water Resources Director by Kenneth Burr Mills and Beatrice Ann Mills for approval of a change in point of diversion of water from Little River, pursuant to the provisions of ORS 540.510 to 540.530.

The certificate recorded at page 22323, Volume 16, State Record of Water Right Certificates, in the names of William E. Crawford and Son (William A. Crawford), describes a right which includes the use of not to exceed 0.03 cubic foot per second from Little River for irrigation of 2.1 acres in Lot 7 (NW 1/4 SW 1/4), Section 7, Township 27 South, Range 2 West, WM, with a date of priority of March 21, 1950.

Water for the said right is diverted from a point located 1240 feet North and 590 feet West from the South Quarter Corner of Section 7, being within the SE 1/4 SW 1/4 of Section 7. Township 27 South, Range 2 West, WM.

The applicants herein, owners of the lands above described, propose to change the point of diversion therefrom to a point located 1930 feet North and 1630 feet West from the South Quarter Corner of Section 7, being within the NW 1/4 SW 1/4 of Section 7, Township 27 South, Range 2 West, WM.

Gary L. Ball, Watermaster, has filed a statement to the effect that the proposed change in point of diversion may be made without injury to existing rights.

No objections having been filed and it appearing that the proposed change in point of diversion may be made without injury to existing rights, the application should be approved.

NOW, THEREFORE, it hereby is ORDERED that the proposed change in point of diversion is approved, without loss of priority.

It is FURTHER ORDERED that the quantity of water diverted at the new point of diversion shall not exceed the quantity of water available at the old point of diversion under the subject right, and shall not exceed 0.03 cubic foot per second.

It is FURTHER ORDERED that the following provisions shall be effective when in the judgment of the Watermaster it becomes necessary to install headgates and measuring devices:

That the diversion works shall include an in line flow meter, a weir, or other suitable device for measuring the water to which the applicant is entitled;

That the type and plans of the measuring device be approved by the watermaster before the beginning of construction work and that the weir or measuring device be installed under the general supervision of said Watermaster.

It is FURTHER ORDERED that the construction work shall be completed and water used from the proposed point of diversion on or before October 1, 1985.

It is FURTHER ORDERED that the certificate recorded at page 22323, Volume 16, State Record of Water Right Certificates, is canceled; and in lieu thereof a new certificate be issued covering the balance of the right NOT involved in this proceeding; and upon proof satisfactory to the Water Resources Director of completion of works and beneficial use of water to the extent intended under the provisions of this order, a confirming certificate of water right shall be issued to the applicants herein.
