ORDER APPROVING
TRANSFER 5334

On August 1, 1983, an application was filed in the office of the Water Resources Director by Richard Caddock for approval of a change in use heretofore made of water from North Umpqua River, pursuant to the provisions of ORS 540.510 to 540.530.

The certificate recorded at page 20890, Volume 15, State Record of Water Right Certificates, in the name of R.H. Franks, describes a right which includes the use of not to exceed 0.006 cubic foot per second from North Umpqua River, for irrigation of a certain 0.3 acre in NE 1/4 SW 1/4 and 0.2 acre in NW 1/4 SW 1/4, as projected within Wm. Trask DLC 40, Section 14, Township 26 South, Range 4 West, WM, with a date of priority of July 16, 1940.

Water for the said right is diverted from a point located 550 feet South and 1125 feet East from the West Quarter Corner of Section 14, being within the NW 1/4 SW 1/4 of Section 14, Township 26 South, Range 4 West, WM.

The applicant herein, owner of the lands above described, proposes to change the use heretofore made therefrom to reservoir maintenance within the NE 1/4 SW 1/4 and NW 1/4 SW 1/4 of Section 14, Township 26 South, Range 4 West, WM.

Notice of the application, pursuant to ORS 540.520(2), was published in The News-Review, a newspaper printed and having general circulation in Douglas County, Oregon, for a period of three weeks in the issues of August 10, 17 and 24, 1983.

Gary L. Ball, Watermaster, has filed a statement to the effect that the proposed change in use heretofore made may be made without injury to existing rights.

No objections having been filed and it appearing that the proposed change in use heretofore made may be made without injury to existing rights, the application should be approved.

NOW, THEREFORE, it hereby is ORDERED that the proposed change in use heretofore made is approved, without loss of priority.

It is FURTHER ORDERED that the quantity of water used for the proposed purpose shall not exceed 0.006 cubic foot per second, and shall be used only during the irrigation season of each year.

It is FURTHER ORDERED that the following provisions shall be effective when in the judgment of the Watermaster it becomes necessary to install headgates and measuring devices:


That the diversion works shall include an in line flow meter, a weir, or other suitable device for measuring the water to which the applicant is entitled;

That the type and plans of the measuring device be approved by the watermaster before the beginning of construction work and that the weir or measuring device be installed under the general supervision of said watermaster.

It is FURTHER ORDERED that the construction work shall be completed and water used for the proposed purpose on or before October 1, 1985.

It is FURTHER ORDERED that the certificate recorded at page 20890, Volume 15, State Record of Water Right Certificates, is canceled; and in lieu thereof a new certificate be issued covering the balance of the right NOT involved in this proceeding; and upon proof satisfactory to the Water Resources Director of completion of works and beneficial use of water to the extent intended under the provisions of this order, a confirming certificate of water right shall be issued to the applicant herein.
