O R D E R

WHEREAS, on the 25th day of August, 1927, an order was entered by the State Engineer canceling Permit No. 5060 in the name of M. G. McKern and other permits under the provisions of Section 5774, Oregon Laws, and

WHEREAS, L. P. Fraker and Edith M. Fraker have petitioned the State Engineer for a reinstatement of this permit and the said Edith M. Fraker has made in said petition a sworn statement that she and L. P. Fraker are the equitable owners of the lands described in Permit No. 5060 and which were to be irrigated thereunder, such lands being under contract of purchase from the Federal Land Bank of Spokane, Washington; that she is informed and believes that the original permittee M. G. McKern had abandoned the lands described in said permit at the time he was notified by registered mail by the State Engineer that final proof must be made if the permit was not to be canceled; that the lands described in said permit or a part thereof were irrigated by said M. G. McKern during the year 1921 and each year thereafter until 1926 and that the petitioners irrigated said lands during the years 1927, 1928 and 1929, and

WHEREAS, the records of this office indicate that there have been no subsequent filings or that there are any other water rights of record affecting the use of water described in this permit and that a reinstatement of the permit would not be an injury to any existing rights.


IT IS THEREFORE ORDERED, that the order of the State Engineer dated August 25, 1927 be revoked in so far as said order applies to said permit No. 5060 and that said permit be considered in good standing, and

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED, that an extension of time be granted to the present equitable owners of the lands described in said permit

within which they may complete and submit a final proof of the appropriation and that said time be extended until October 1, 1930.
