On November 17, 1977, an application was filed in the office of the Water Resources Director by Leslie and Marjorie Walker for approval of a change in point of diversion from Canyon Creek, pursuant to ORS 540.510 to 540.530.

The certificate recorded at page 19652, Volume 14, State Record of Water Right Certificates, in the name of John Hamlin, describes a right which includes the use of not to exceed 0.002 cubic foot per second from Canyon Creek for irrigation of a certain 0.07 acre in SE^1_4 NW^1_4 of Section 27, Township 30 South, Range 5 West, W.M., with a date of priority of January 2, 1947.

The authorized point of diversion for said right is located 530 feet North and 2200 feet East from the West Quarter Corner of Section 27, being within the SE^{1}_{4} NW^{1}_{4} of Section 27, Township 30 South, Range 5 West, W.M.

The applicants herein, owners of the lands above described, propose to change the point of diversion therefrom, without loss of priority, to a point located 25 feet South and 15 feet East from the Northwest Corner of Lot 4 of Canyon Creek Estates, being within the SE^{1}_{4} NW^{1}_{4} of Section 27, Township 30 South, Range 5 West, W.M.

Mr. M. John Youngquist, Watermaster, has filed a statement to the effect that the proposed change in point of diversion may be made without injury to existing rights.

No objections having been filed and it appearing that the proposed change in point of diversion may be made without injury to existing rights, the application should be approved.

NOW, THEREFORE, it hereby is ORDERED that the requested change in point of diversion as described herein, without loss of priority, is approved.

It is FURTHER ORDERED that the quantity of water diverted at the new point of diversion shall not exceed the quantity of water available at the old point of diversion under the subject right, and shall not exceed 0.002 cubic foot per second.

It is FURTHER ORDERED that the following provisions shall be effective when in the judgment of the watermaster it becomes necessary to install headgates and measuring devices:

That the diversion works shall include an in line flow meter, a weir, or other suitable device for measuring the water to which the applicant is entitled;

That the type and plans of the measuring device be approved by the watermaster before the beginning of construction work and that the weir or measuring device be installed under the general supervision of said watermaster.

It is FURTHER ORDERED that no time need be fixed for completion as the change in point of diversion is complete.

The order approving transfer No. 3852 provided for cancellation of the said certificate of water right recorded at page 19652, Volume 14, State Record of Water Right Certificates, and issuance of a new certificate covering the balance of the right NOT involved in the transfer proceedings; therefore,

It is FURTHER ORDERED that upon proof satisfactory to the Water Resources Director of completion of works and beneficial use of water to the extent intended under the provisions of this order, a confirming certificate of water right shall be issued to the applicants herein.
