Authority

OAR 690-380-6020 establishes an application process and criteria for the review of extensions of time for the completion of changes authorized under water right transfers.

Findings of Fact

- 1. On October 3, 2012, the Department received an application for extension of time for water right transfer T-10080 from Dan Bradley, for the North Clackamas County Water Commission, the transfer applicant.
- 2. The Water Resources Department issued an order approving Transfer Application T-10080, in the name of North Clackamas County Water Commission, on June 19, 2006. The order was recorded in Special Order Volume 68, at Page 704. The order set a transfer completion date of October 1, 2011.
- 3. The applicant and Oak Lodge Water District have completed improvements to the Oak Lodge Pump Station, but the applicant has been unable to fully complete the changes by the deadline because of faulty membranes in the filtration system.
- 4. To fully complete the changes, it will be necessary for the applicant to continue working with the manufacturer of the system (Siemens) to resolve the problems with the membranes, in order to gain full supply capacity for the municipal system.
- 5. The applicant has requested that the time for completion of beneficial use be extended to October 1, 2016.

This final order is subject to judicial review by the Court of Appeals under ORS 183.482. Any petition for judicial review must be filed within the 60-day time period specified by ORS 183.482(1). Pursuant to ORS 536.075 and OAR 137-003-0675, you may petition for judicial review or petition the Director for reconsideration of this order. A petition for reconsideration may be granted or denied by the Director, and if no action is taken within 60 days following the date the petition was filed, the petition shall be deemed denied.

Conclusions of Law

Pursuant to OAR 690-380-6020, the Director of the Water Resources Department concludes the applicant has shown reasonable diligence to complete the transfer within the time period established by the order approving Transfer Application T-10080 and the requested time is reasonable.

Now, therefore, it is ORDERED:

The time for completion of beneficial use authorized by T-10080 shall be extended to October 1, 2016.
