ORDER APPROVING
TRANSFER NO. 4612

On October 6, 1980, an application was filed in the office of the Water Resources Director by Antonio Calderone for approval of a change in point of diversion of water from Umpqua River, pursuant to the provisions of ORS 540.510 to 540.530.

The certificate recorded at page 44464, Volume 36, State Record of Water Right Certificates, in the name of P.W. George, describes a right which includes the use of not to exceed 0.049 cubic foot per second from Umpqua River for irrigation of a certain 1.68 acres in NE 1/4 SE 1/4, 0.66 acre in NW 1/4 SE 1/4, 1.10 acres in SW 1/4 SE 1/4 and 0.50 acre in SE 1/4 SE 1/4, all as projected within J. Cooper DLC 44, Section 20, Township 23 South, Range 7 West, W.M., with a date of priority of March 12, 1951.

Water for the said right is diverted from a point located 1700 feet North and 720 feet West from the Southeast Corner of Section 20, being within the NE 1/4 SE 1/4 of Section 20, Township 23 South, Range 7 West, W.M.

The applicant herein, owner of the lands above described, proposes to change the point of diversion therefrom, without loss of priority, to a point located 1900 feet North and 1100 feet West from the Southeast Corner of Section 20, being within the NE 1/4 SE 1/4, Section 20, Township 23 South, Range 7 West, W.M.

Mr. M. John Youngquist, Watermaster, has filed a statement to the effect that the proposed change in point of diversion may be made without injury to existing rights.

No objections having been filed and it appearing that the proposed change in point of diversion may be made without injury to existing rights, the application should be approved.

NOW, THEREFORE, it hereby is ORDERED that the requested change in point of diversion, as described herein, without loss of priority, is are approved.

It is FURTHER ORDERED that the quantity of water diverted at the new point

of diversion shall not exceed the quantity of water available at the old point of diversion under the subject right.

It is FURTHER ORDERED that the following provisions shall be effective when in the judgment of the watermaster it becomes necessary to install headgates and measuring devices:


That the diversion works shall include an in line flow meter, a weir, or other suitable device for measuring the water to which the applicant is entitled;

That the type and plans of the measuring device be approved by the watermaster before the beginning of construction work and that the weir or measuring device be installed under the general supervision of said watermaster.

It is FURTHER ORDERED that the construction work shall be completed and the change in point of diversion of water made on or before October 1, 1982.

It is FURTHER ORDERED that the portion of the right involved in the change authorized herein NOT be included in the new certificate to be issued as provided by the order entered January 30, 1978, approving transfer application number 3726; and upon receipt of proof satisfactory to the Water Resources Director of completion of works and beneficial use of water to the extent intended under the provisions of this order, a confirming certificate of water right shall be issued to the applicant herein.
