ORDER APPROVING AN ADDITIONAL POINT OF DIVERSION

Pursuant to ORS 540.510 to 540.530, after notice was given and no objections were filed, and finding that no injury to existing water rights would result, this order approves, as conditioned or limited herein, TRANSFER 7267 submitted by

The first right to be modified was confirmed by decree of the Circuit Court of the State of Oregon for Jackson County as evidenced by a Certificate 68345. The decree is recorded in the Order Record of the Water Resources Director in Volume 16, at Page 523. The date of priority is 1902.

The right allows the use of EVANS CREEK, a tributary of the ROGUE RIVER, for IRRIGATION OF 24.8 ACRES. The amount of water to which this right is entitled is limited to an amount actually beneficially used and shall not exceed 0.41 cubic foot per second, if available at the authorized point of diversion: SW¼ SW¼, Section 15, T.35S., R.4W., W.M., 1140 feet North and 810 feet East from the SW corner of Section 15, or its equivalent in case of rotation, measured at the point of diversion from the source.

The second right to be modified was confirmed by decree of the Circuit Court of the State of Oregon for Jackson County as evidenced by a Certificate 48142. The decree is recorded in the Order Record of the Water Resources Director in Volume 16, at Page 523. The date of priority is 1902.

The right allows the use of EVANS CREEK, a tributary of the ROGUE RIVER, for IRRIGATION OF 8.3 ACRES. The amount of water to which this right is entitled is limited to an amount actually beneficially used and shall not exceed 0.14 cubic foot per second, if available at the original points of diversion: NE¼ SW¼, Section 15, T.35S., R.4W., W.M., between a point

located 360 feet South and 1320 feet West from the NE Corner, NE% SW%, Section 15 and a point 460 feet downstream, or its equivalent in case of rotation, measured at the point of diversion from the source. The authorized point of diversion is located SW% SW%, Section 15, T.35S., R.4W., W.M., 1240 feet North and 1780 feet West from S% Corner, Section 15.

The authorized place of use is located as follows:

The right to use water for the above purpose is restricted to beneficial use on the lands or place of use described and is subject to all other conditions and limitations contained in the decree.

The applicant proposes to add an ADDITIONAL POINT OF DIVERSION located SE¼ SE¼, Section 16, T.35S., R.4W., W.M., 830 feet North and 130 feet West from SE corner, Section 16.

THIS CHANGE TO AN EXISTING WATER RIGHT MAY BE MADE PROVIDED THE FOLLOWING CONDITIONS ARE MET BY THE WATER USER:

- 1. The proposed change shall be completed on or before October 1, 1997.
- 2. The quantity of water diverted at the new point of diversion, together with that diverted at the old diversions, shall not exceed the quantity of water lawfully available at the original points of diversion.

- When required by the Department, the water user shall install and maintain a headgate, an in-line flow meter, weir, or other suitable device for measuring and recording the quantity of water diverted. The type and plans of the headgate and measuring device must be approved by the Department prior to beginning construction and shall be installed under the general supervision of the Department.
- 4. Water shall be acquired from the same surface water source as the original point(s) of diversion.

Certificates 68345 and 48142 are cancelled. When satisfactory proof of the completed change is received, new certificates confirming these water rights will be issued.
