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On June 15, 1983, an application was filed in the office of the Water Resources Director by John and Eva Richards for approval of a change in point of diversion of water from Evans Creek, pursuant to the provisions of ORS 540.510 to 540.530.

By Supplemental Decree of the Circuit Court for Jackson County, Oregon, entered May 19, 1964, In the Matter of the Determination of the Relative Rights to the Use of the Waters of Rogue River and Its Tributaries, a water right was established in the name of Albert A. Arends, tabulated in Volume 13, page 386, Order Record of the Water Resources Director, for use of the waters of Evans Creek for irrigation of, among other lands, a certain 4.8 acres in NE 1/4 NE 1/4, 1.5 acres in NW 1/4 NE 1/4, 1.4 acres in SW 1/4 NE 1/4 and 0.9 acre in SE 1/4 NE 1/4, Section 9, Township 36 South, Range 4 West, WM, with a date of priority of 1902, as evidenced by the certificate recorded at page 32799, Volume 24, State Record of Water Right Certificates.

Water for the said right is diverted, through the Old Mill Ditch, from a point located 470 feet South and 1920 feet East from the Northwest Corner of Section 4, being within the NE 1/4 NW 1/4 of Section 4, Township 36 South, Range 4 West, WM.

The applicants herein, owners of the lands above described, propose to change the point of diversion to a point located 1100 feet South and 430 feet West from the Northeast Corner of Section 9, being within the NE 1/4 NE 1/4 of Section 9, Township 36 South, Range 4 West, WM.

Notice of the application, pursuant to ORS 540.520(2), was published in the Mail Tribune, a newspaper printed and having general circulation in Jackson County, Oregon, for a period of three weeks in the issues of July 1, 8 and 15, 1983.

Bruce R. Sund, Watermaster, has filed a statement to the effect that the proposed change in point of diversion may be made without injury to existing rights.

No objections having been filed and it appearing that the proposed change in point of diversion may be made without injury to existing rights, the application should be approved.

NOW, THEREFORE, it hereby is ORDERED that the proposed change in point of diversion is approved, without loss of priority.

It is FURTHER ORDERED that the quantity of water diverted at the new point of diversion shall not exceed the quantity of water available at the old point of diversion under the subject right, and shall not exceed 0.15 cubic foot per second.

It is FURTHER ORDERED that the following provisions shall be effective when in the judgment of the Watermaster it becomes necessary to install headgates and measuring devices:


That the diversion works shall include an in line flow meter, a weir, or other suitable device for measuring the water to which the applicant is entitled;

That the type and plans of the measuring device be approved by the Watermaster before the beginning of construction work and that the weir or measuring device be installed under the general supervision of said Watermaster.

It is FURTHER ORDERED that the construction work shall be completed and water used from the proposed point of diversion on or before October 1, 1985.

It is FURTHER ORDERED that the certificate recorded at page 32799, Volume 24, State Record of Water Right Certificates, is canceled; and in lieu thereof a new certificate be issued covering the balance of the right NOT involved in this proceeding; and upon proof satisfactory to the Water Resources Director of completion of works and beneficial use of water to the extent intended under the provisions of this order, a confirming certificate of water right shall be issued to the applicants herein.
