ORDER

On August 8, 1983, Walter B. Scott of Scott Livestock Company submitted an affidavit that Scott Livestock Company is the owner of a certain water right and the lands to which the water right is appurtenant; that Scott Livestock Company has abandoned any and all interest in and to the said water right and requests the same be canceled.


The water right in question was established by Decree of Circuit Court for Malheur County, entered June 6, 1916, in the Matter of the Determination of the Relative Rights to the Use of the Waters of Willow Creek, tabulated in the names of A.E. High, M.G. Hope and I.W. Hope, at page 290, Volume 3, Order Record of the Water Resources Director, and is a portion of the right described by the certificate recorded at page 1858, Volume 3, State Record of Water Right Certificates, in the names of A.E. High, M.G. Hope and I.W. Hope, and is for the use of not to exceed 0.04 cubic foot per second of water from Little Willow Creek and Turner Creek, with a date of priority of 1903, for irrigation of 17.0 acres in NE 1/4 SE 1/4, Section 34, Township 16 South, Range 43 East, WM.

ORS 540.621 provides that: "Whenever the owner of a perfected and developed water right certifies under oath to the Water Resources Director that the water right has been abandoned by him and that he desires cancellation thereof, the Water Resources Director shall enter an order canceling the water right."

NOW, THEREFORE, it is hereby ORDERED that the said water right, being a portion of the right described by the certificate recorded at page 1858, Volume 3, State Record of Water Right Certificates, is canceled.

It is FURTHER ORDERED that the said certificate of water right is canceled, and in lieu thereof a new certificate be issued to describe the balance of the water right NOT involved in this proceeding.
