Authority

Oregon Revised Statute (ORS) 537.705 and 540.505 to 540.580 establish the process in which a water right holder may submit a request to temporarily transfer the place of use and, if necessary to convey the water to the temporary place of use, the point of appropriation authorized under an existing water right. Oregon Administrative Rule (OAR) Chapter 690, Division 380 implements the statutes and provides the Department's procedures and criteria for evaluating transfer applications.

Findings of Fact

1. On July 25, 2019, JACOB ANTON AND JACLYN OLIVIA SCHOCK filed an application to temporarily change the place of use and add an additional point of appropriation to serve the proposed place of use under Certificate 30880 for a period of 5 years. The Department assigned the application number T-13229.
2. On November 12, 2019, Hollië Cannon, agent for the applicant, submitted a written request by email on behalf of Jacob Anton and Jaclyn Olivia Schock, requesting Temporary Transfer Application T-13229 be withdrawn.

Now, therefore, it is ORDERED:

Temporary Transfer Application T-13229, in the name of JACOB ANTON AND JACLYN OLIVIA SCHOCK, is withdrawn and of no further force or effect.
